### Broncos fill empty spot with Stanford alum

DENVER (AP) — Filling the roster spot vacated by the injured Gus Frerotte, the Denver Broncos on Thursday signed free-agent quarterback Todd Husak.

Husak most recently was on the New York Jets' practice squad.

The 6-foot-3, 216-pound Husak was a sixth-round draft pick of the Washington Redskins in 2000. He saw action in the final game of his rookie season, completing 2-of-2 passes for minus-2 yards.

The Redskins' new coaching staff cut Husak last summer. The Jets signed him to their practice squad on Oct. 2, where he remained until the Broncos signed him.

Frerotte, Denver's backup quarterback, was placed on injured reserve Wednesday because of a separated throwing shoulder. Defensive end Kavika Pittman also went on injured reserve with a torn calf muscle, but the Broncos haven't filled his roster spot.

'We had Todd ranked fairly high

coming out of the draft," coach Mike Shanahan said Thursday. "We liked what we saw coming out of college.

"With our quarterback situation, we were hoping we'd be able to get him off the practice squad, which we did. It's good to have him in. We're going to get a chance to evaluate him.'

Husak now becomes third-string behind Brian Griese and Jarious Jackson

Griese missed last week's game in Kansas City with a concussion but is expected to return when the Broncos, in the midst of a bye week, return to action against Oakland on Dec. 30.

Husak was one of the most prolific quarterbacks in Stanford history, finishing fifth in passing yards (6,564) and TD passes (41). As a junior, he became the third Stanford quarterback to throw for more than 3,000 yards in a season (3,092), joining Steve Stenstrom (3,627 in 1993) and John Elway (3,242 in 1982).

Shea finished second at a World Cup skeleton meet Thursday to earn a spot on the U.S. Olympic team and make his family the first to produce three generations of American Olympians.

"I'm really excited to have this tradition," Shea said. "To be able to follow in my grandfather's and my father's footsteps is a great honor."
