## today in history

**December 24, 1901:** Mrs. Joseph Collier, who has been living in Arkansas several years, has returned to Sherman County to make her home. Mrs. Collier and her family were the first settlers in Sherman County. Her son, Charles Collier, was the first white child born in this county. (NOTE: The Sherman County history books state that the first white child born in the county was a granddaughter of Mrs. Collier. Artie Melstrom, who was the daughter of Andrew and Sarah (Collier) Maelstrom.

**December 25, 1901:** Homemade Table 'Sirup' — Many housekeepers prefer homemade table sirup to any other. Its flavor is equally good and its purity unquestioned. It is easily made in sufficient quantity to last for weeks at a time in cool weather. The proportions is two pounds C sugar to one pint of water. Boil ten minutes. Pure maple sugar got direct from some farmer's sugar may be shaved and melted with the other sugar as flavoring, or a small bottle of reliable brand of pure maple sirup may be used to flavor a double quantity of the proportions given. Pour the sirup into glass jars and keep sealed, in a cool place.
