# Six youths win **Hoops Shoot**

The Goodland Daily News About 60 young athletes from seven area schools shot free throws Saturday in the Elks Hoop Shoot, but only the six winners will go on to the district competition in Russell Saturday, Jan. 5.

In the 12-13 year old boys competition, a three-way tie for first required a tie-breaker shoot off. Michael Doll, son of Greg Doll of Goodland, came out on top after hitting five of five shots in the tie-breaker.

After another five shots, Jance McKee, son of Jim and Judy McKee of Goodland, was in second after hitting four of five in the second round. Taylor Elder of Sharon Springs was in third with three of five.

All three boys hit 21 of 25 shots in the original shoot, and McKee and Elder each hit three of five in the first tiebreaker.

Among the 12-13 year old girls, the winner was Ashley Christians, daughter of Julie Christians of Goodland, for 17 of 25 shots. Second place went to Mimi Swiatkowski of Burlington with 16 of 25.

Winner for the 10-11 year old boys was Jeff Reid, son of Nate and Judy Reid of Brewster, with 20 of 25 shots. Second place went to Tate Andrews of Sharon Springs with 14 of 25 shots. For the 10-11 year old girls, throughout the U.S. each year.

Samantha Raymer, daughter of Steve and Debra Raymer of Goodland, came out on top with 15 of 25 shots. Raney Okeson of Weskan was second with eight of 25.

Winner of the eight to nine year old boys was Brock Wilkens, son of Chuck and Alicia Wilkens of Goodland, with 20 of 25 shots. Tadd Andrews of Sharon Springs was second with 14 of 25.

Schools represented at the Goodland Shoot-off were: Goodland, Brewster, Colby, Weskan, Sharon Springs, Burlington and Bethune, Colo.

Winners of the shoot in Russell will go on to the state hoop shoot Saturday, Feb. 9, at the Santa Fe Elementary School Lindley Hall in Newton.

Winners from the state competition will go on to the Regional Shoot in Denver March 15 and winners there will go on to the national competition.

The Elks Hoop Shoot free throw contest began in Corvallis, Ore. in 1946 and is now in its 30th year as a National Elks Youth Program. Over three million boys and girls participate

Officials hit the Chargers' strong safety with two penalties in the last two minutes of Kansas City's 20-17 win on Sunday. His penalty for roughing the passer wiped out what should have been a game-icing interception for the Chargers, and a call for defensive holding in the end zone set up Tony Richardson's 1-yard touchdown run with 48 seconds left.

"Santa Claus came early," Chiefs coach Dick Vermeil said.

The Chargers, who lost their eighth straight game after being flagged three times in the last 2:05, agreed.

"The officials made the calls, and we just have to live with them," Harrison said. "We just got a bunch of bad breaks all of a sudden."

Defensive tackle Leonardo Carson, whose interception was nullified by Harrison's roughing penalty, initially declined comment on the calls. But when pressed about their impact on a defense that thought it had just won the game, Carson said with a shrug:

Green scrambled 13 yards to the 9 on the next play, then saw Carson's apparent interception wiped out by Rodney Harrison's roughing penalty.

"I was just checking my mouth for my teeth," Green said. "It was a big hit. I still don't know who did it or where it came from."
