PHOENIX (AP) - Colorado players and fans are feeling better about the system after the Bowl Championtheir chances of winning a share of the national title.

The third-ranked Buffaloes arrived on a chartered flight late Tuesday for their New Year's Day date with No. 2 Oregon in the Fiesta Bowl.
