Wayne Gattshall

Sherman County farmer and newspaper columnist Wayne Alfred Gattshall, 78, died Saturday at Goodland Regional Medical Center.

He was born March 10, 1923, at Flagler, Colo., the son of Millie B. (Hartzler) and Frank Q. Gattshall. He graduated from Flagler High School in 1941 and married Carol Maude Johnson on Nov. 4, 1951, in St. Francis.

He farmed near Goodland for 60 years, and for the last five years was a columnist for newspapers in Kansas, Colorado and Nebraska.

Prior to retiring, he was active in agricultural, political and farming associations. He was writing a book on historical perspectives of farming.

Preceding him in death were a daughter, Leta Cates, his parents and a sister, Laveta Loutzenhiser.

Survivors include his wife; six children, David (Rita) Gattshall of Thornton, Colo.; Leland Gattshall of Valley Center; Karen S. (Scott) Hooker of Kanorado; Ruth Gattshall of Valley Center; John (Wanda) Gattshall of Kansas City; and Alvin (Barbara) Gattshall of Jackson Lake, Texas; a brother, Wallace (Vera) Gattshall of Goodland; nine grandchildren; and a great grandchild.

Services will be at 10 a.m. Thursday at the Koons Chapel with the Rev. Robert Snyder officiating. Burial will follow in the Goodland Cemetery.

Visitation will be from 3-7 p.m. Wednesday at the chapel, with the family present from 6-7 p.m.
