

Practice makes perfect

Defense helps in comeback win

The Goodland Daily News With exceptional defensive and bench play, the Goodland Cowboys "C" team turned a 12-point deficit into a 53-45 win against Weskan at a home basketball game on Monday.

Coach Travis Witman said the Cowboys had a hard time getting into the game at first, but turned up the volume in the third quarter to snatch the team's sixth win of the season.

"We started out very flat and had a hard time getting any shots to fall," he said. "

We scored only 6 points in the first quarter. Fortunately for us, Weskan also had a hard time scoring.'

The Cowboys were up by 2 at the end of the first quarter, but allowed Weskan to close the gap in the second. The teams were tied at 20 at halftime and then Weskan took off in the third.

"After being tied at halftime, we came out and turned the ball over the first five times we touched it," Witman said

"We quickly got down by 12 points.'

The coach said he decided it was time for a strategy change.

"About mid-way through the third quarter," the coach said, "I called a time out and we switched defenses from a half-court trap to a full-court man-toman."

Witman said the team began to play excellent defense, making several quick turnovers and easy buckets, and Livengood shot one three-pointer.

game," he said, "and had we not made this run on them in the third quarter, we would have probably lost the game."

The Cowboys stayed the line in the fourth quarter, outscoring Weskan 20 to 11. Though the first half of the game wasn't great, Coach Witman said he was proud of his players.

"I was pleased with the way the team responded and played together when we were down 12 in the third," he said. "It says a lot about the character of a team that can play their way back into a game."

The coach said the team's bench play was excellent, and Josef Felver and Craig Mason came off the bench to contribute some great minutes.

"After the game," Witman said, "I told the boys that you have to be ready to play whenever you step on the court whether that is at the beginning of the game or after halftime."

He said he hopes the players learned a lesson from the game and will be mentally ready to face Oberlin today. The "C" teams will take the court in Oberlin to dace the Red Devils at 3:45 p.m. Mountain Time.
