# Cowgirls extend streak with overtime win

The Goodland Daily News The Cowgirls won their second overtime game of the season and extended their winning streak to five over the weekend with wins Friday at St. Francis, 50-42, and Saturday in overtime against Hays High, 55-48, at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The wins bring the Cowgirl season record to 11-4. They have a 6-1 record away and a 5-3 record at Max Jones Fieldhouse, where they have won their last two home games.

Friday, the Cowgirls will seek to extend their winning streak when they host the Lady Plainsmen from Oakley. The varsity game will start about 5:30 p.m. with the junior varsity following about 7 p.m.

The Cowgirls got off to a very slow start against St. Francis, but the Lady Indians weren't doing much better. The St. Francis girls took an early 2-0 lead, and it wasn't until five minutes later that the Cowgirls scored their first 12. point on a free throw by Jayci Stone. Stone and Erica Mann hit baskets in the final two minutes of the first to give the cowgirls a 5-2 lead.

St. Francis' inability to score followed them into the second quarter. In the first three minutes, they added one point on a free throw by Kander Raile.

Late in the quarter Kelsey Andrest hit two baskets and a free throw and Samantha Coates added in a free throw

Cowgirl scoring in the second quarter totaled 16 points with Lacey Brenner exploding for 6 points, 4 from Stone and 2 each from Jessica Osborn, Hayley Jarmin and StevieLee Raymer. The Cowgirls led 21-9 at half.

With a comfortable lead, the Cowgirls held off the Lady Indians in the second half, outscoring them 13-12 in the third and being outscored by St. Francis 21-16 in the fourth to win 50-

Brenner got the hot hand in the first half, scoring her 6 points in the second quarter, and Anny McCoy and Osborn picked up the pace in the second half. McCoy had 4 of her 10 points in the third and 6 in the fourth.

Osborn added 6 of her 8 in the fourth with two baskets and two points from free throws.

Stone led the Cowgirls in scoring in both wins with 13 points against the Lady Indians of St. Francis. Stone had 7 points in the first half during Friday's game, and added 4 in the third and sank two free throws in the fourth for her 13






