Searchers dig up five more bodies

NOBLE, Ga. (AP) — Searchers discovered a new pit containing five corpses and investigators said there is no end in sight to their gruesome task of finding discarded bodies on the grounds of a Georgia crematory.

Searchers found the new pit Sunday as they worked to clear trash, brush and timber from grounds near Tri-State Crematory. They found bones scattered near the surface, then dug by hand and came upon five corpses.

The bodies brought the total to 306. Sixty-five had been identified, and authorities hoped DNA collected from families would help identify more.
