Jack C. Lamb

Jack C. Lamb, 69, a long-time Wallace County Angus rancher, died Monday, February 18, 2002 at Presbyterian-St. Luke's Hospital in Denver after a long struggle with chronic pulmonary disease.

He was born May 20, 1932, in Russell Springs to Charles and Mabel Lamb. He grew up in Winona, and later moved to the ranch west of Russell Springs, where he lived for the last 51 years.

He began at an early age helping out in the family's general store in Winona. When the ranch on the Smoky Hill River was purchased in 1943, he showed his preference for working with cows by spending as much time as he could helping there. After graduating from high school in 1950, he went to Colorado State University at Fort Collins, and began a veterinary medicine curriculum. His education was cut short when he was needed at the ranch, and he returned to Kansas, where he remained for the rest of his life.

On January 21, 1951, he married Beth Ausmus in Winona. The couple made the ranch their home, and together built a purebred Angus cattle operation which earned national recognition. He was very close to his
