Martin L. Felzien

Martin L. Felzien, 78, veteran and sportsman from Kanorado, died Sunday, March 17, 2002, at the Goodland Regional Medical Center.

He was born Oct. 16, 1923, in Goodland, the son of George D. and Josephine (Tagmeyer) Felzien. He was baptized as an infant at a country church near St. Francis, and was confirmed into the Goodland Emmanuel Lutheran Church as a youth. He later joined the Kanorado United Methodist Church.

He attended country school and graduated from Goodland High School in 1942. He served in the Army Air Corps from November of 1942 through October of 1945.

On Nov. 14, 1943, he married Ruth Ann Hines in Colby.

He retired from 25 years in the grocery business in Kanorado and 31 years as a rural mail carrier.

He was a councilman in Kanorado for several years and served several terms as mayor. He was on the Kansas Area Board for the Aging and was a lifetime member of the Goodland Elks Lodge and the Veterans of Foreign Wars. He was in the 459th Bomb Group Association and the 15th Air Force Association.

Preceding him in death were his parents.

Survivors include his wife; a daughter, Karen (Lee) Walters of Canon City, Colo.; a son, Mark (Bobbi) Felzien of Kanorado; three sisters, Lorraine (Bob) Fenner of Goodland, Lavina (Floyd) Yoder of Kingman and Lovella Lloyd of Russellville, Ark.; a brother, Jalmer (Thelma) Felzien of Wichita; five grandsons; and two great-grandsons.

Services will be at 10:30 a.m. Thursday, March 21, 2002 at Koons Chapel in Goodland with Pastor Carol Moore Ramey and Pastor Leonard Fox officiating. Burial will follow at the Kanorado Cemetery.

Abortion bills pass

TOPEKA (AP) — Two bills backed by abortion opponents have cleared a House committee, one revising the state's parental notification law and the other creating an "Unborn Victims of Violence Act."

On an 11-7 vote, the Federal and State Affairs Committee endorsed a bill requiring doctors to notify a parent or guardian by certified mail or in person when a girl under 18 seeks an abortion.

State law already requires notification but does not spell out how it must be made. The bill also would amend the law to make it harder for doctors to get around the notice requirement by declaring that the girl faces an emergency.

The "Unborn Victims" measure would declare that "an unborn child" is a person or human being in Kansas criminal law, allowing prosecution for the death or injury of fetus.

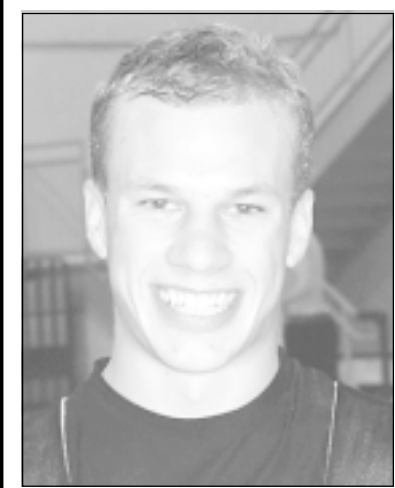
