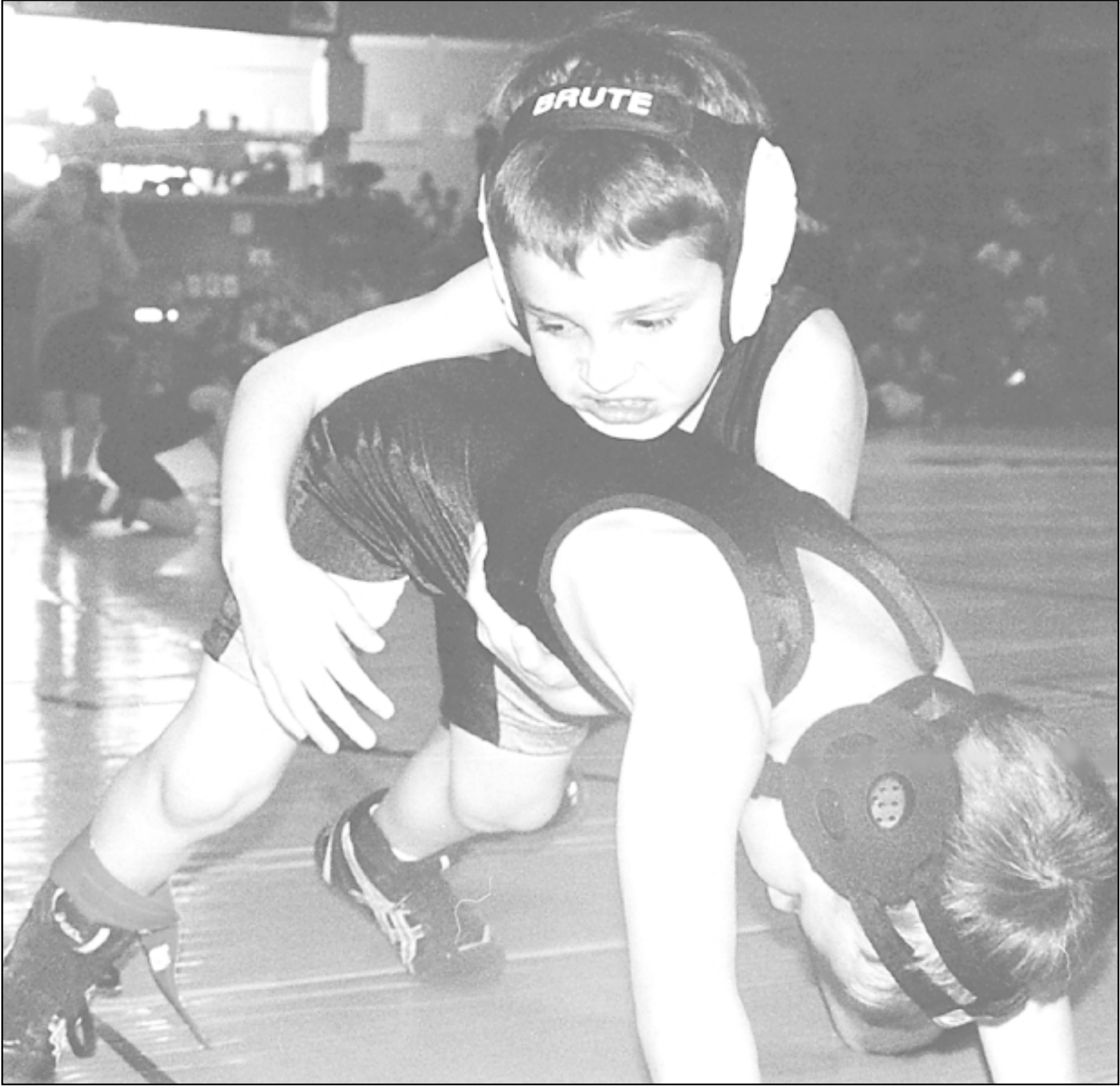
Eight and under: Laine Herl, third, 88; Austin Avelar and Seth Miller, participated.
