Students honored in Washington, D.C.

Two Goodland High School students were honored at the Veterans of Foreign Wars Community Service Conference in Washington, D.C. on April 5.

Amanda Hoffman, the daughter of Rich and Lyn Hoffman, won a \$1,500 scholarship in the National Voice of Democracy contest for being the Department of Kansas winner. She was 21st out of 54 entries. There were 58 scholarships totaling \$148,000 awarded in the contest.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars Eagle Scout of the Year was also announced at the conference. David Russell, son of Curt and Kathy Russell, was fourth.

The winner was from Louisiana and was awarded a \$5,000 scholarship.

This is the second year in a row that the department winner in the Voice of Democracy contest has been from Goodland.

The theme for this year's contest was "Reaching Out to America." The winner was Allegra Guarino from New York who received a \$25,000 scholarship.

Grace Viron Carmichael Pash, 91, former secretary at KLOE Radio and Television, died Thursday, April 11, 2002, at the Good Samaritan Village in St. Francis, where she had been a resident since 1997.

She was born on Nov. 18, 1910, in Fayetteville, Ark., the daughter of H.D. and Olive Miller.

As a small child, Grace and her two sisters, Edna and Ruth, moved with their parents to Oberlin, Kan., where

she lived until she was 16.

On May 22, 1931, Grace married Hugh Carmichael in St. Francis. After 38 years of marriage, Hugh died in 1969. On April 15, 1973, Grace married Wayne Pash in Goodland. Wayne died in October, 1993.

Grace was a member of the First Christian Church in St. Francis and Goodland all of her adult life.

As a young 16-year-old, Grace made her own living as times were difficult. She first moved to Burlington, Colo., and worked as a waitress then onto Goodland and then to St. Francis, where she met Hugh Carmichael.

Grace loved to dance. She often told her family of the fun-filled barn and school house dances. At the Good Samaritan Village, where she spent her last days, she enjoyed the music and dances. Grace loved how Cathy Loop would really swing her around.

Grace was a wonderful seamstress who made most of her daughters' clothes as they were growing up. She also took great joy in sewing for her granddaughters.

Grace had many jobs. She ran a cafe in Idalia and St. Francis for a few years when her girls were young. She worked at Ben Franklin and later became manager. She managed the Jones Dress Shop and also worked at Willard's Furniture. She worked at Rieb's Skogmos in St. Francis, and later after she married Wayne, she worked at Schneiders Dress Shop in Goodland and as a secretary at KLOE Radio and Television, where Wayne was the engineer.

She enjoyed life, but when her daughter Viron died in 1983, it was the hardest thing she ever had to endure.

In 1991, Wayne retired and after 22 years they moved back to St. Francis which was a very happy time for Grace. They had a fifth-wheel trailer and traveled many places. They both had a passion for fishing and Grace loved her bingo games.

Survivors include two daughters, Marjorie (Jack) Lampe of St. Francis, and Cherree (Ken) Halbleib of Plainview, Texas; eight grandchildren, 13 great-grandchildren, and three great-great grandchildren; and a nephew, Dwight Nelson, who lived with Grace and Hugh from his eighth grade year until graduating from high school.

Services were held April 13 at the St. Francis First Christian Church with the Rev. John Bartlett officiating.
