Farm bill details begin emerging

WASHINGTON (AP) — Kansas lawmakers on Wednesday gave producers some good news and some bad news about the newly agreed-upon farm bill in Congress.

The good news, said Rep. Jerry Moran, is that the measure is projected to provide \$314 million more to Kansas farmers during sustained periods of low crop prices. Overall, planned agriculture spending would grow by \$73.5 billion over the next 10 years.

The bad news, said Sen. Pat Roberts, is that producers of wheat and other crops may have to wait until more than a year from now to get the same level of assistance they would have gotten this fall under current farm policy. Roberts is unsure whether he will support the farm bill, he said.

Congressional leaders announced an agreement last Friday.
