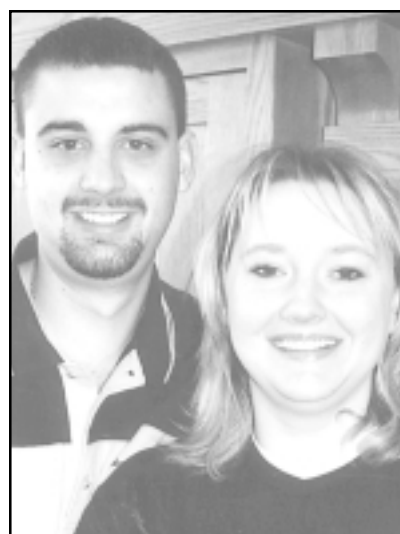

ant and nice toward other participants, spectators, program officials, judges, the media, supporters, and others.

- Teach him to give others the benefit of the doubt. Teach him to treat people, animals and things kindly.

- Teach him to be considerate and thoughtful in all he says and does, regardless of whether he does well or not, or whether he wins or loses.

- Teach him to be friendly and cheerful. Teach him to refrain from ill humor and arguing. Teach him to keep his or her emotions under control.

- Teach him to accept judges' suggestions and the results with a positive attitude. Teach him to congratulate winners.

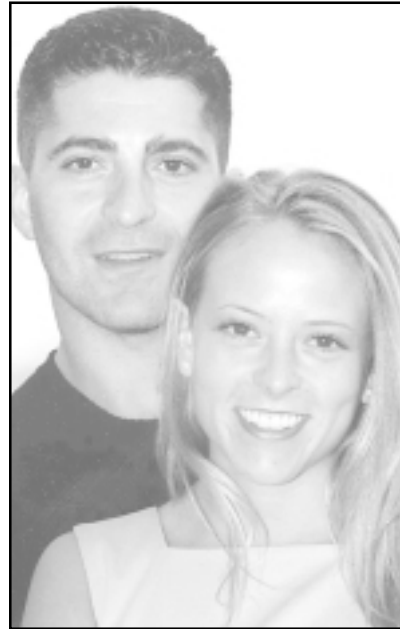
- Teach him not to gripe, complain or make excuses when he doesn't win or perform well. Teach him to take the things that happen at the program, and the results, with grace and good temper.

# Mulches insulate soil, smother weeds and trap water

Except for plastic mulches, mulches used in vegetable gardens tend to insulate the soil and prevent it from warming rapidly.

By about the second week in May, soils are usually warm enough that mulches can be used without restricting the growth and development of plants that need warmer temperatures to grow.

It is usually mid-May before weed problems begin, so earlier mulching isn't really needed.

The thickness of the mulch layer needs to be adjusted according to the materials used. Coarse materials need a thicker layer than more finely textured materials.

Avoid using material such as wet grass clippings that pack into a dense, tight layer that restricts air and water movement into the soil.

Dried grass clippings, however, make a good mulch applied in a thin layer.

Also avoid using grass clippings from lawns where broadleaf weed control products may have been applied to control dandelions this spring.

Mulch controls weeds by smothering them. It holds water in the soil by protecting it from evaporation. Many summers, a good mulch layer can be as or more effective than timely watering, but watering and using a mulch is the best combination.
