Arvene W. Eckhardt, 69, of Goodland died Sunday, May 12, 2002, from injuries from a car accident near Greeley, Colo.

Survivors include his wife, Doris Eckhardt of Goodland; a son, Dallas (Patty) Eckhardt of Goodland; a daughter, Chris Friede of Fort Collins, Colo.; three sisters, Delores Parker of Albuquerque, N.M., Dorothy Bashon of Gill, Colo., and LaDonna Swanson of Estes Park, Colo.; a brother, Bob Eckhardt of Parker, Colo.; and two grandchildren.

Services will be at 1 p.m. Friday, May 17, 2002, at the Longmont First Evangelical Lutheran Church with the Rev. Bruce A. Welander officiating. Burial will be in the Longmont Mountain View Cemetery.
