McKee said each school entered two singles and two doubles teams. Each team that wasn't seeded drew for spots, he said, adding that the Cowboys had unlucky draws, with two teams facing state qualifiers in the opening round.

Smoky Valley took first with 10 points; Abilene was second with 10; Concordia, third, 7; Ulysses, fourth, 6; and Chapman, fifth, 2.

In singles, Cowboy Jake Johnson lost 10-9 and 8-6 to Phil Schindler of Colby in a match to determine which team would play the No. 5 seed Tyler Harkeness of Scott City. McKee said Johnson had an exceptional game, coming the closest to beating Schindler that any Cowboy has all season.
