Goodland athletes qualify for state in 11 events Mai earned second in the intermedi-

The Goodland Daily News The Cowgirls came in second at the Chapman, and 10 Goodland students qualified for the state meet this weekend in Wichita.

For the girls, Rachael Hagerman, who had three gold medals, will run in the 100-meter dash, high hurdles and intermediate hurdles; Kendra Billinger will compete in the 3,200-meter run; Jayci Stone, pole vault; Andrea Fenner, discus; Alisha McKee, shot put; and Lacey Brenner, high jump.

On the boys' side, Aaron Gittinger will run the 800-meter dash: Bryan Mai, intermediate hurdles; and the team of Anthony Benavides, Sam Smith, Mai and Gittinger will compete in the 4X400-meter relay.

Out of 16 teams in Chapman, the girls finished second, and the boys 10th. Two students won first place 0. medals. Hagerman won all three of her events, and Stone won the pole vault and placed sixth in the high jump.

Dennis Stone, one of Goodland's head coaches, said he had high hopes for the girls' 4X400-meter relay team, but Brenner, the team's starter, was disqualified by the starting official.

"We can't figure it out," Stone said. "We never got a clear answer from the official."


