**May 26, 1902:** Reports of county assessors show and increase of 115 people, 3,295 compared to 3,180 in 1901.

**May 27, 1902:** The number of county acres under fence increased from 71,932 in 1901 to 97,597 in 1902.

# Pope doesn't believe Bulgaria connected to assassination attempt

SOFIA, Bulgaria - Pope John Paul II told Bulgaria's president today that he never believed allegations that there was a Bulgarian connection to the 1981 attempt on his life, a Vatican spokesman said.

"I never believed in the so-called Bulgarian connection because of my great esteem and respect for the Bulgarian people," the pope told President Georgi Parvanov in an official meeting, according to papal spokesman

Joaquin Navarro-Valls.

It was the first time John Paul has publicly expressed his view about lingering suspicions that Bulgarian secret agents were behind Turkish gunman Mehmet Ali Agca's shooting of the pope in St. Peter's Square in Rome on May 13, 1981. An Italian court acquitted three Bulgarians of complicity, citing a lack of evidence.

Bulgarian agents had been suspected

of working for the Soviet KGB, said at the time to have been alarmed by John Paul's support for the Solidarity trade union in his native Poland.

TEL AVIV, Israel - The car wheeled sharply and barreled toward the crowded nightclub, a load of pipe bombs inside. A security guard opened fire, killing the driver and preventing what authorities said was the second of

two major attacks targeting Tel Aviv in less than 24 hours.

The guard thwarted the attacker's plan to blow up the "Studio 49" club, where about 200 people were dancing early today, said Tel Aviv police commander Yossi Sedbon. "A big tragedy was averted here," he said.

On Thursday morning, a bomb went off under a tanker truck at Israel's main fuel depot, just outside Tel Aviv, but the blast did not ignite the huge fuel tanks and nobody was hurt. Sedbon called it a "miracle."

The guard who shot the suspected attacker early today, Eli Federman, 36, told reporters he saw a car turn sharply and race toward the club. He said he opened fire and hit the man, who started falling out of the car, setting off a blast.

"Then I fired the rest of the bullets into his head," killing him, he said. One other person was wounded.

## NATIONAL

NEW YORK - His wife's plea for leniency rejected, a former police officer was sentenced to five to 15 years in prison for a drunken-driving crash that killed a family of four.

Joseph Gray, 41, was led from the courtroom in handcuffs to begin his term after he received the maximum sentence Thursday. He apologized to

the victims' families.

Gray, who quit the force three weeks after last year's accident, has been jailed since his May 3 manslaughter conviction.

Gray's wife, Diana, asked state Supreme Court Justice Anne Feldman for leniency. The 15-year veteran policeman and his wife have three daughters. Feldman said that while she believed Gray was "fully remorseful," the maximum term was needed as a deterrent.

According to prosecutors, Gray was on a 12-hour drinking binge that began in the parking lot of the 72nd Precinct and led to the Wild Wild West topless bar before he drove his minivan into the family as they crossed a Brooklyn street last Aug. 4.

Maria Herrera was killed with her son, Andy, and her sister, Dilcia.

## RESOLUTION 02-9

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN INCREASE IN THE MILL LEVY FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF

THE COUNTY HOSPITAL BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Sherman County, Kansas, that:

Section 1: Sherman County, Kansas, hereby elects to authorize an increase in the tax levy, pursuant to K.S.A. 19-4606a, as amended; the present two (2) mill tax levy shall be increased to six (6)

mills for a period not to exceed three (3) years for the tax years of 2002, 2003 and 2004, and such tax shall not be subject to or within any aggregate tax levy limit prescribed by law; after which time the levy rate will revert back to two (2) mills.

Section 2: This resolution shall be published once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in the official county newspaper.

Section 3: This resolution shall take effect thirty-one (31) days after its final publication unless sufficient petitions for a referendum are

filed as provided in accordance with K.S.A. 19-4606a, as amended, in which case this resolution shall become effective upon approval by a majority of electors voting at an election held on this resolution.
