Goodland wins seven medals at state meet

Cowgirls place 13th out of 44 teams

The Goodland Daily News Goodland High School can add

seven more pictures to its display case of state medal winners after the track teams' performances in Wichita on Friday and Saturday.

The girls came up with four medals at the state tournament, including one for second place, and the boys earned three, capping off a season filled with individual honors and team trophies.

The Cowgirls earned 17 points, to finish 13th out of 44 teams, and the boys ended up 21st of 47 teams with

The boys had won the Northwest Kansas League Tournament, and ended up 10th at the regional competition. The girls ended up second at both the league and regional meets.

The boys team had a lot of depth, said Dennis Stone, one of the team's head coaches, and did well at smaller

competitions, where there was no limit on how many people could compete in an event. The girls had a smaller team of fine athletes, he said, and did well at larger meets.

The girls' 4X400-meter relay team was expected to do well at the state meet, but it was disqualified at regionals. Stone said he never figured out what went wrong, and the ruling official never gave a clear explanation. The Cowgirls had a shot at second place, Stone said, and the missing event hurt the team's score.

Rachael Hagerman competed in three events at the state meet, and placed second in the high hurdles with a final time of 15.39 and a preliminary time of 15.46. She earned a seventhplace medal in the 100-meter dash with a preliminary of 12.89 and a final of 13.33, and ran the intermediate hurdles in 48.12.

Jayci Stone earned third in the pole vault with 10 feet, 6 inches.

Lacey Brenner got sixth in the high jump with 5-0.

Every Goodland boy who went to the tournament came back with at least one medal.

Aaron Gittinger and Bryan Mai both earned fifth in individual events, Gittinger in the 800-meter dash with 2:00.37 and Mai in the intermediate hurdles with a preliminary time of 41.41 and a final of 41.22

The third Cowboy medal was for sixth place in the 4X400-meter relay. Anthony Benavides ran his 400 meters in 52.49, Sam Smith 51.44, Mai 52.36 and Gittinger 66.05 for a total time of 3:42.34. They ran it in 52.9, 52.6, 52.8 and 51.77 for 3:30.07 during the preliminary round.

Kendra Billinger ran the 3,200meter in 12:24.63.

Alisha McKee ended up with 34-5 1/2 in the shot put.

Andrea Fenner threw the discus 100-10.
