Bush envoy to try to help defuse conflict between Pakistan and India

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan — An envoy dispatched by President Bush to help defuse the latest crisis between nuclear-armed rivals India and Pakistan began his mission today as artillery fell silent across the disputed Kashmir frontier.

Deputy Secretary of State Richard Armitage, who has a reputation for blunt talk, immediately went into a meeting with Pakistani Foreign Secretary Inam Ul Haque amid extremely

tight security.

"Hopefully we're going to have a good discussion," said Armitage, who Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee, was to meet later with Foreign Minister Abdul Sattar.
