

# Goodland smashes St. Francis

## Game ends early after Goodland leads 13-3 in the sixth inning

Goodland beat St. Francis 13-3 and 10-1 Wednesday in an American Legion doubleheader at Memorial Park.

The first game ended one out into the bottom of the sixth inning when Keith Vasquez drove in Brock Lohr for the final run. The first game in an American Legion doubleheader usually lasts seven innings, unless one team is far enough ahead to give the other team little chance to catch up.

The last time Goodland played St. Francis on Saturday the game ended in the third inning with Goodland up 23-3.

On Wednesday, the St. Francis pitcher had trouble throughout the game, giving up runs in every inning but the fourth. Jace Terry didn't have many problems on the mound for Goodland. He pitched three scoreless innings, then allowed one run in the fourth and fifth.

In the sixth, Terry moved over to second base and let Jared Doke take over. Doke allowed only one run.

Goodland allowed one hit in the first inning. After the first batter popped out to center field, the second hit a grounder past the shortstop. The runner managed to steal second and third before the next two batters struck out.

Aaron Gittinger got on base his first try due to an error by the third baseman, and he scored when Vasquez got a base hit. Vasquez later stole home when the St. Francis catcher lost a pitch to the backstop.

In the second inning, Goodland's Jake Johnson hit a weak grounder to the pitcher for one out, and Jason Fletcher struck out swinging. Gittinger was walked, then stole three bases on three consecutive pitches to score. Vasquez drove in Kevin Schulte for the final run of the inning.

Goodland came up with three runs in the third. Jared Doke got a base hit, then tried to steal second, and several infield errors let him round the bases.

The first St. Francis batter of the fourth drew a walk, stole second and got to third on an error. A later batter grounded out, letting the runner on third score for the team's first run.

After St. Francis scored again in the fifth, Goodland answered with three runs. Jason Fletcher got on base first by beating out a bunt. Gittinger hit a grounder past second, and he and

Fletcher made it all the way to home. Kevin Schulte scored the third run, tagging up at third and beating a throw to home with a slide.

St. Francis got its one point in the sixth by stealing home on a wild pitch. Doke scored Goodland's first run in the inning by doing the same thing, and Johnson followed his example a few pitches later. After Vasquez hit his RBI-single, the umpire called the game.

Matt Kuhlman pitched the second game of the double header, winning 10-1. The second game of a double-

header is five innings. St. Francis scored its one point in the second inning.

Goodland's Jace Terry drove in Kevin Schulte in the second. West drove in Gittinger in the third, and Doke singled, bringing in Lohr.

Goodland scored seven times in the fourth. Kyle Schulte, Gittinger, Lohr, West, Vasquez, Doke, and Johnson all crossed the plate. St. Francis did not get a hit after the second inning.

The team next plays Scott City at 5:30 p.m. Monday at Memorial Park.

## Red Sox hit grounders; Rockies fumble them

BOSTON (AP) — Mike Hampton picked a bad night to be a ground-ball pitcher.

Hampton got the Boston batters to hit grounders, but the Colorado Rockies defense made five errors and several other miscues Wednesday night, and the Red Sox won 7-5.

"You might look at me like I'm crazy, but he threw the ball well," Rockies manager Clint Hurdle said of Hampton.

Hampton (3-8) allowed seven runs — five earned — on 10 hits and two walks. He struck out two in five innings to fall to 1-7 with an 8.55 ERA away from the supposed pitchers' purgatory of Coors Field.

"He made the pitches, he kept the ball down, he got ground balls on a wet track," Hurdle said. "We didn't defense behind him very well."

Frank Castillo (5-6) allowed five runs on eight hits and three walks, striking out four in 6 1-3 innings for his third win in his last four starts.

Ugueth Urbina pitched the final two innings for his 19th save, striking out four in his longest appearance of the season.

Nomar Garciaparra reached base three times without a solid hit, but made two of Boston's three errors.

"Everybody was having a tough time gripping the ball," Garciaparra said. "It was rough."

Rockies shortstop Juan Uribe had two errors, and second baseman Terry Shumpert, third baseman Todd Zeile and Hampton each had one as Colorado lost for the fifth time in six

interleague games. The five errors were a season high and one shy of the franchise record — perhaps a result of the 54-degree temperature combined with a stiff wind and occasional drizzle.

Garciaparra singled in a run in the third inning when Zeile fielded his grounder at third base and hesitated while he considered throwing home. The throw to first was late.

Garciaparra took second when Uribe made an error by leaving the base early on a potential force at second. Garciaparra took third on a fielder's choice and scored when Hampton walked Doug Mirabelli.

Zeile's error in the fourth allowed Garciaparra to reach for the second time.

He doubled in the sixth when his blooper dropped behind first base.

## New Cardinals home should be downtown

ST. LOUIS (AP) — While 15 proposals to build the St. Louis Cardinals a new stadium have crossed his desk, team President Mark Lamping said Wednesday the club belongs downtown.

That's where a new ball park will likely be built.

"We need to replace Busch Stadium. Busch Stadium will be replaced," Lamping told the St. Louis Post-Dispatch.

"We hope that it happens in the city of St. Louis and downtown. It is where it belongs. We want to get it done in downtown. No one should be confused by that."

Lamping's comments have softened substantially since May 17, when the Missouri House adjourned without taking a vote on the state's share of a public funding package that would have replaced Busch Stadium with a \$646 million stadium and "Ballpark Village" development.

That day, less than an hour after the Legislature adjourned, Lamping said the team would begin exploring alternative locations in the St. Louis area.

"I can no longer say that downtown is the most likely site for the new ballpark," Lamping said at the time.

Since then, Lamping said the team has proposals for a new stadium from both cities and counties in Missouri and Illinois, as well as private developers.

He declined additional comment on the stadium proposals, saying only that some of them had been dismissed.

Earlier Wednesday, St. Louis Mayor Francis Slay again stressed the city's commitment to keeping the Cardinals in downtown and promised to make a new proposal to the team "within the next couple of months."

It is unlikely that proposal will include any role for the state, since Lamping said the Cardinals have no plans to go back to lawmakers in Jefferson City seeking assistance.

"We're a long way from where we are now to where we're going to be," Lamping said, "but the Cardinals' preference has not changed. That is downtown St. Louis as part of a neighborhood."
