Game ends early after Goodland leads 13-3 in the sixth inning

The first game ended one out into the bottom of the sixth inning when Keith Vasquez drove in Brock Lohr for the final run. The first game in an American Legion doubleheader usually lasts seven innings, unless one team is far enough ahead to give the other team little chance to catch up.

Goodland allowed one hit in the first inning. After the first batter popped out to center field, the second hit a grounder past the shortstop. The runner managed to steal second and third before the next two batters struck out.

Aaron Gittinger got on base his first try due to an error by the third baseman, and he scored when Vasquez got a base hit. Vasquez later stole home when the St. Francis catcher lost a pitch to the

In the second inning, Goodland's Jake Johnson hit a weak grounder to the pitcher for one out, and Jason Fletcher struck out swinging. Gittinger was walked, then stole three bases on three consecutive pitches to score. Vasquez drove in Kevin Schulte for the final run
