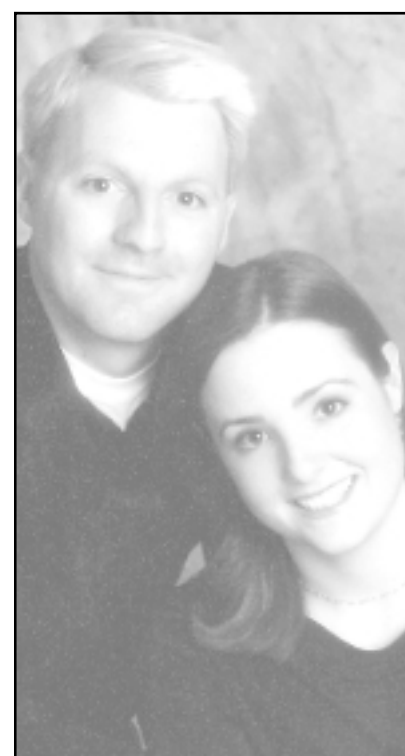

# Volunteers 'Join Hands' to clean shelter site, haul meals



## Adults and children work together for good

Thirty-five volunteers, adults and children, tackled the lawn, trees and bushes at the Northwest Kansas Animal Shelter site this week, and 25 people are delivering meals on wheels, all as part of a national event.

The Aid Association for Lutherans and the Lutheran Brotherhood worked with Cub Scout Pack 142 and parents on a clean-up of the animal shelter site on the south side of Business U.S. 24.

The clean-up was one of the groups' projects for Join Hands Day this Saturday. Some of those helping with the project were not going to be available on the 15th, said association Recorder Mary Lou Isernhagen, so the groups planned to start the clean-up on Saturday and finish next Saturday.

Despite that plan, the groups went right to work and finished the project, she said.

The association bought everyone T-shirts and furnished lunch, Isernhagen said, with help from McDonald's and Wal-Mart. The Chamber of Commerce provided lunch last year, she said, but worked with the groups on the project this year.

Carrying the meals are volunteers from the church's traveling day camp, which has replaced Vacation Bible School. Counselors come out from the church's camp at Skyland Ranch in Colorado, Isernhagen said, to conduct the day camp for first through seventh graders.

This is the third year the groups have "joined hands" to complete a project. In 2000, the groups cleaned the church site. Last year, the groups had 35 volunteers to clean the animal shelter site and to carry Meals on Wheels for the preceding week, Isernhagen said.

Isernhagen said she ordered 80 of the Join Hands Day T-shirts and hoped to

have that many volunteers to wear them. With 60 volunteers, she was pretty close.

She said she would like to add another project for next year's Join Hands Day.

The Join Hands Day web site says the national event is sponsored by America's Fraternal Benefit Societies, the Points of Light Foundation and the Volunteer Center National Network.

The purpose of the day is to get youths and adults to work together on projects to benefit their communities, to make friendships across the generations and to help prepare young people to take leadership roles in many organizations.

The event is held on the third Saturday in June. Groups participating in the event register with the national organization on their web site at www.joinhandsday.org before the day and report on their projects after the event.
