## Ten pulled uninjured from lake

JUNCTION CITY (AP) — Six adults and four children were rescued uninjured after their boat capsized on Milford Lake in northeast Kansas, au-

thorities said. Geary County Sheriff Jim Jensen said the odds were slim that all 10 people would escape uninjured in Tuesday night's accident, apparently caused by overcrowding on the boat.

Everyone aboard had a life jacket. The boat overturned about one-half mile from shore, near Junction City. More than two hours later, one person reached the shore and summoned help.

cookies or passing on the daily newspaper or recent magazines can give you an opportunity to check on them without being obvious. Other family members may be un-

aware of the elderly couple's situation. that might indicate abuse, neglect or exploitation in the elderly, some of which will be more obvious than oth-

- Unsanitary living conditions or lack of electricity, heat, water or refrigeration.
- · Bruises, burns, fractures, swelling and untreated injuries. Prolonged intervals between injury and treatment. frequent changes in doctors, or inconsistent explanations of injuries should also be considered as possible signs of abuse or neglect.
- Sudden weight loss or gain, dehydration or malnutrition or inappropriate or inadequate clothing.
- Over-medication, medicines not
