Dear Plain Sense: It has been five years since my son was killed in an accident.

Friends and relatives keep telling me to stop crying and get on with life. Because my son was a grown adult, with wife and children, these people seem to think my grief shouldn't be so intense. Are they right?

It is obvious to most people that the rest of our life. pain of losing a young child is a very



one of friendship and sharing. In addition, parents expect their children to continue the family lineage, traditions and values and sometimes even the family home and/or business.

Friends and relatives do not always know what to say or how to say it. There are support groups available, as well as clergy and mental health professionals who have experience in helping people through such difficult times.
