lican candidates for governor voiced added that he does not believe the state sharply different opinions Tuesday is spending enough money on its pubnight about budget issues, with State lic schools. Treasurer Tim Shallenburger declaring himself the most conservative.

Shallenburger repeated his promise not to increase taxes if elected governor, even in the face of the state's ongoing budget problems. He said the state can spend less money without sacrificing services, but he added that "you just can't be the savior of govern-

Wichita Mayor Bob Knight agreed the state has to exercise fiscal discipline but wouldn't pledge to avoid a tax increase, instead saying that he would protect education and vital services.

Senate President Dave Kerr, of terspending \$750,000 to reinforce the Hutchinson, also said he would protect dome.

Dan Bloom, a Eudora businessman

and former school superintendent in his hometown, said he would push for an increase in the state's property tax levy for schools. Bloom also expressed support for an


