Member Ron Schilling approved the depositories, but said the board should split its money between all of the banks in Goodland, not just two.

"That's my yearly speech," he said. The board agreed to keep Vignery and Mason as its law firm and named *The Goodland Daily News* as the district's official newspaper.

Members appointed Mike Campbell as representative on the Northwest Kansas Educational Service Center board, Bonnie Smith as the Kansas Public Employees Retirement System representative, Selby as the transportation and food service program repre-

sentative and Schilling and Ben Duell as the Kansas Association of School Boards government relation network representatives.

Russell and Short were appointed to the bid committee, Duell and Philbrick to the policy review committee and Duell and Eric Gray to the insurance committee.

Russell and Philbrick were named board representatives on the Professional Development Council and the teacher contract negotiation team. Selby was selected as representative of federal programs and as the district's freedom of information officer.

Duell and Gray were appointed to the calendar committee and Schilling

and Philbrick to the technology committee.

In other business, the board:
• Heard from Selby that sale of the Edson gym and the discipline policy at the high school will be on the agenda for the meeting Monday, July 22. Members discussed having the gym appraised, but didn't make a decision.

• Approved paying about \$34,700 in monthly bills.
