

Rockies lose to Padres

DENVER (AP)—Twenty-year-old rookie Oliver Perez allowed one hit over 6 2-3 innings and struck out a career-high 13, and Ryan Klesko hit two home runs Sunday as the San Diego Padres ended a six-game losing streak with a 7-1 win over the Colorado Rockies.

Perez (3-1) struck out the side in the second, fifth and sixth innings in winning for the first time in three starts. He fell two strikeouts short of the franchise single-game record of 15 set by Sterling Hitchcock on Aug. 29, 1998, against Montreal and by Fred Norman on Sept. 17, 1972. He walked five and allowed only Larry Walker's two-out double in the third inning.

Perez also got his first major league hit in the second inning.

Ross Gload singled off Trevor Hoffman in the ninth for the Rockies only other hit.

Klesko went 2-for-4 with his 16th and 17th home runs of the year and drove four runs. Ramon Vazquez had four hits for the Padres who avoided matching their longest losing streak of the year.

Shawn Chacon (3-6) struggled through 5 2-3 innings, allowing three runs and nine hits in failing to win for his sixth straight start.

Klesko gave San Diego a 1-0 lead in the first inning with a bases-loaded ground out. The Padres left the bases loaded in the second, but Klesko extended the lead in the third inning with a solo home run leading off the third.

Drinking OK if tailgating

LAWRENCE (AP)—The University of Kansas is extending its policy allowing football fans to drink alcohol at tailgating parties before home games.

Last season, Kansas lifted its 10-year-old ban on alcohol consumption, and allowed people to imbibe as long as they were in clearly marked and established tailgating areas around Memorial Stadium.

Chancellor Robert Hemenway announced Friday that the school would continue to allow alcohol in designated areas in the parking lot during the six home football games.

More signs will be added to provide guidelines on responsible tailgating, he said, and the boundaries of the designated tailgating areas will be simplified.

Alcoholic beverages are not allowed inside the University of Kansas stadium.

Kansas public safety Officer Brad Clover said the changes would benefit the fans.

"Last year, tailgating seemed to work out pretty well," Clover said. "Our goal is just for people to comply with the law. I think the modifications will make the people more aware of the law."

Unexpected green flag cost Hornish race

KANSAS CITY, Kan. (AP)—A green flag had Sam Hornish Jr. seeing red.

When a late wreck took leader Tomas Scheckter out of Sunday's Ameristar 200, the Indy Racing League's defending champion figured all he had to do was make the restart and hold everyone else off for a couple

of laps.

But when the green flag came during the 198th lap of the 200-lap, 300-mile race — after an aborted restart in the 197th lap — Hornish said it caught him by surprise. Airton Dare passed him in the third turn, then held on for his first IRL victory in 31 starts.

"I had it in third gear," Hornish said.

"I didn't know what was going on. I had to go down to second and try to go. You're a sitting duck at that point."

Hornish also accused Dare of squeezing him in the turn on the race-winning pass, a charge Dare denied.

"I didn't do anything," Dare said. "I gave him some room — actually, more room than he gave me previously. But

he's the kind of guy that wins a lot of races, and you know he's not used to finishing second."
