KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Texas Rangers closer Hideki Irabu will stay in the hospital for treatment to the small blood clots in his lungs rather than fly home to Texas on Tuesday night as originally planned, the team said.

"They just don't think it's wise, so soon after his episode, to put him on a plane," Rangers spokesman Rich Rice

"He's not in any danger, they just don't want him to have a recurrence in the air, where nothing can be done," Rice said. He said it is unclear when Irabu will be released, but that he is 'progressing fine, from what we're

Irabu was taken to St. Luke's Hospital by assistant trainer Ray Ramirez about 3 a.m. CDT Monday after complaining of chest pains and shortness of breath. He was given medication and blood thinners to dissolve the clots and was scheduled for additional tests to determine where the clots formed.

The team originally said Irabu would fly back to Texas after Tuesday night's game against the Kansas City Royals.

Rice said Ramirez, assistant general manager Dan O'Brien, and pitching coach Orel Hershiser have visited

Irabu led the Rangers with 16 saves and had a 3-8 record with a 5.74 ERA in 38 games. He was placed on the 15day disabled list, retroactive to Satur-


