

Goodland wins first zone game

Schulte hits inside the park homerun, team goes on to play No. 1 Scott City

An inside the park homerun helped Goodland score seven times in one inning, paving the way for a 15-2 victory over Bucklin in the first round of the American Legion zone tournament.

They will face off with top-seeded Scott City at 5 p.m. today.

Goodland went into the tournament seeded fourth out of six teams and a 10-10 record. Scott City and Colby, the first and second-ranked teams, both advanced with a bye.

Bucklin, fifth in the bracket with a 9-12 record, went home after only five innings of play. Goodland's Matt Kuhlman pitched the first four innings, then handed the mound over to Jared Duke for what turned out to be the last inning.

Bucklin came up with a 1-0 lead at the end of the first, but Goodland's batters went through the lineup almost 1 and a half times in the second, scoring seven runs.

Jace Terry started the inning out by getting hit by a pitch. Brock Lohr singled, Keith Vasquez walked, then Jordan Riebel drove in a runner with a hit to the shortstop. Andrew Melia walked and Kyle Schulte batted him in a run with a single.

Kyle Schulte scored when his brother, Kevin, hit an inside the park homerun.

"They are both really fast," said team manager Liz West. "It was wonderful to watch."

Landon West, Kuhlman and Terry all singled in the second, and Brock got an RBI with a sacrifice fly. Bucklin scored its second, and last, point in the second.

In the third, Kevin Schulte was hit by a pitch and was driven in by Landon West, who was thrown out at third but credited with a hit. Kuhlman drew a walk, Terry doubled, Lohr got a base hit, and Goodland finished out the inning with a 10-2 lead.

Aaron Gittinger, the team's only left-handed batter, started out the fifth with a single. Kuhlman and Duke walked, and Vasquez drove in two runs with a double. Riebel singled, and drove in two more. Bucklin couldn't score in their half of the fifth, and the game ended under the mercy rule.

"They really played together as a team," West said. "They looked good."

If the boys beat Scott City a 4 p.m., they will play at 6 p.m. Saturday. If they go to the losers' bracket, they play at 7 p.m. today.

Infielder breaks batting slump, leads Colorado over Arizona

DENVER (AP) — Colorado Rockies manager Clint Hurdle was unsure whether to play shortstop Juan Uribe. In the end, he did and was very happy about the choice.

"I wrote Juan in when I showed up, but I wasn't sure he was playing until he showed up," Hurdle said. "When I grabbed him in front of his locker is when we both knew he was playing."

Uribe, mired in an 0-for-24 slump, took advantage of the decision by delivering a tiebreaking two-out, two-run single in the seventh inning as the Rockies defeated the Arizona Diamondbacks 6-4 Thursday.

Larry Walker went 3-for-3 with two RBIs and a walk as he improved his batting average to .349. Making his 100th career start, Colorado's John Thomson allowed four runs

and seven hits, and Justin Speier (4-0) pitched a perfect seventh to earn the win.

"There was no way I wasn't going to play," said Uribe, whose batting average dipped to a season-low .234 after his first two hitless at-bats. "I had been making a lot of mistakes and wanted to make up for them."

With the game tied, Walker led off the seventh with a single off Greg Swindell (0-1), who was replaced by Mike Koplove one out later. Todd Hollandsworth was walked intentionally and stole second without a hit to set up Uribe.

Uribe hit a flare to right, just out of second baseman Junior Spivey's reach, to score Walker and Hollandsworth.

Infielder back from disabled list

DENVER (AP) — The Colorado Rockies activated infielder Greg Norton from the disabled list before Thursday's game with the Arizona Diamondbacks.

To make room for Norton, Colorado optioned outfielder Ross Gload to Colorado Springs. Gload was hitting .250 this season with an RBI in nine games with

the Rockies. Norton had been out since July 1 because of a strained hamstring. During a three-game rehab assignment at Triple-A Colorado Springs, Norton went 1-for-12 with three walks.

"Norton is ready and we needed his bat," manager Clint Hurdle said.

Swimmers get five gold, three 'high-point' trophies

Goodland swimmers took first in five events at the Northwest Kansas League championships Friday and Saturday in Colby, and won five silver medals.

Three swimmers came away with high-point trophies for the season. Daniel Blake earned the second most points in the 15-18 boys' division, and Daron Roeder fourth. Hannah Blake placed fifth in the 9-10 girls' division.

The league includes 10 towns from northwest Kansas and northeast Colorado. In the Colby meet, Daniel Blake won the long 400-yard freestyle in 4 minutes 58.58 seconds and took second in the 200-yard freestyle with 2:15.26, 200-yard individual medley 2:30.85 and 100-yard breaststroke 1:14.23.

He tied for third in the 100-yard butterfly with 1:14.66. Hannah Blake tied for first in the 25-yard freestyle in 15.63. She placed fourth in the 25-yard butterfly with 18.72 and the 100-yard

freestyle in 1:21.83. In the 100-yard individual medley she finished in 1:34.88 for fifth.

In the 15-18 boys' division, Jordan Bedore placed second in the 50-yard freestyle in 25.73, and fourth in the 100-yard freestyle with 1:02.06, and the 100-yard backstroke in 1:16.83.

In the same division, Roeder earned second in the 100-yard backstroke with 1:12.69. He tied for third in the 100-yard butterfly with 1:14.66, and placed third in the 200-yard individual medley with 2:52.41.

He finished the 50-yard freestyle in 26.48 and the 200-yard freestyle in 2:52.41 for fourth. Erok Roeder, 9-10 boys', tied for sixth in the 25-yard breaststroke with 24.07 and earned sixth in the 25-yard backstroke in 23.55.

Other swimmers at the Colby meet include Rachel Horney, Taryn Bedore, Randy Cochran, Amber Webster, R.J. Phifer and Whitney Dautel.
