

90-year-old unfazed by hole-in-one

CONCORDIA (AP) — Winifred Danenbarger Wilson has been playing golf for 50 of her 90 years. But on one great day this summer, the only number that mattered was: One.

Wilson sank a hole-in-one shot on the 127-yard, par 3, No. 8 hole at the Concordia Country Club on July 22.

She was hesitant to look into the cup after she hit the shot.

"She wouldn't believe me," said her husband, O.D. Wilson. "She said it went over the green."

"I got down to the green and didn't see it," said his wife, who goes by the nickname Pete. "I had hopes it had gone in."

Using a 5 wood, Wilson had driven her tee shot straight at the hole.

Her accomplishment has created a buzz around Concordia. Pete Wilson is unfazed and a little befuddled by all the fuss.

"It was 127 yards. It was a fairly easy hole to get one," she said. "This time it just went in. I don't know why they're making so much of it. Maybe it's because of my age."

This isn't the first pleasant memory she'll have of the golf course. It's where she met her husband 10 years ago.

Kids' rodeo a thrill and fright at same time

and are only allowed to sign-up for three.

The kids compete for medals, Dautel said, but it never gets too fierce.

"It's mainly for fun," he said. "They're all winners out here as far as we're concerned."

But the youngsters and their parents still take the rodeo seriously.

As kids chased pigs around a pen on the track in front of the corral, their parents stood to the side yelling "grab it, grab it" and "don't let go."

During the goat-tail tie, in which kids had to grab a black ribbon off a goat's tail, parents lined up with video recorders and cameras. They shouted

encouragement and instruction to their offspring.

Tara Avelar, Aaron's mom, said it can get stressful watching your children participate in the rodeo events. She said her heart jumped when she saw the sheep Aaron was riding ram the fence.

"As light as he is," she said, "I can't believe he didn't fly off. It's kind of scary — for moms, anyway."

It was the same for other parents.

Connor Simpson, 6, said there were some uncertain moments during the goat-tail tie, although he was never scared.

"I snuck up on it and grabbed it," he said, "then he jumped on me, too."

Shannon, Connor's mom, admitted it scared her a little.

"I didn't know what was going to happen," she said.

Dautel said this is the first year he has been in charge of the rodeo, though he's helped run it for 10 years. He said it took about three months to organize the event, including finding the livestock, rodeo clowns and other volunteers.

All of the fair volunteers were wearing red-white-and-blue hats in keeping with the fair's theme, "Proud to be American."

Most of the participants don't have to spend any time preparing for the Kids' Rodeo, Dautel said, except those that compete in the horse events.

"These kids practice all year," he said.

Taylor Peden, 8, was dwarfed by the horse she was sitting on while waiting for her turn during the barrel races.

She said she and her horse, "Apache," prepare for the contest at home using barrels and flags.

After she finished the course, Peden said her horse got a little spooked by the lights in the arena. She said they've been practicing at a neighbor's lighted track to help Apache get used to the lights.

"Last year, he knocked over a barrel when the lights came on," she said, "so he's doing better."

Taylor said she's getting better at riding Apache, too.

"He's real fast," she said. "When he turns left, you just about fall off."
