Dear Plain Sense: Not only do I worry about my elderly mother's health, but now I find her too trustful of sales people and am afraid she will be taken advantage of financially. What do we need to be aware of?

Growing up in a time when doors were never locked and everyone looked out for their neighbor, it is often difficult for some of our elderly loved ones to realize when they are being taken advantage of.

Maintaining good communication and regular contact with elderly parents is one way to be more aware of exploitation attempts. Be particularly mindful of the following:

Nothing is free! Encourage your mother to say "no" when promised something for nothing.

- Don't let salespeople in your home, or fall for their hard-luck stories. Encourage her to let you know if this hap-
- Ask the caller to mail the information.


