Diana Lynn Tompkins, 43, a cowgirl from Goodland, died Thursday, Aug. 22, 2002, in a one-vehicle accident.





June 30, 1911 August 21, 2002 Dorothy Pauline Coons was born June 30th, 1911 at Valley Falls in Jefferson County, Kansas, as the second child of Merten Thomas and Alta Mae (Strawn) Williams. She moved with her family to Kanorado, Kansas in 1915. Dorothy attended Kanorado High School, where she played girls basketball and excelled in drama. She graduated in 1931. She attended beauty school in Denver, then worked for her older sister, Diva Mae Heston as a beautician in Goodland, Kansas. She later opened her own business, Dorothy's Beauty Shop, which she operated out of her home in Goodland. On October 30th, 1938, she married James Thomas Coons, son of Everett and Dora Coons. The newlywed couple lived for a short time in Grand Junction, Colorado, before moving to Goodland in 1940. In addition to her avocation, she greatly enjoyed china painting, quilting, knitting, cooking and other handiwork. However, her family was always the main focus of her life. In 1963, the couple moved to Cortez, Colorado. Dorothy and Jim traveled the southwest United States extensively and learned about Native American history and culture. They also enjoyed mushroom hunting, bottle hunting, fishing and camping with their children and grandchildren. In 1974, they moved to Hutchinson, Kansas, to be nearer to their family. Dorothy was a member of P.E.O. in both Cortez and Hutchinson. Over the last 28 years, Dorothy was an active grandparent and homemaker; giving haircuts, canning summer vegetables, sewing toys and clothes, attending recitals, football games and wrestling matches. She developed as a master quilter, creating many family keepsakes, and even gaining first prize for her age division for a quilt in the 1998 Kansas State Fair. She was a gifted storyteller and enjoyed passing on the oral history of her family. In her final years, she most enjoyed her gift of 7 greatgrandchildren, and any time she could be together with her family, especially on holidays. She died of natural causes on Wednesday, August 21st, 2002 at the age of 91, and will be laid to rest next to her husband of 63 years. She was preceded in death by her father Merten, her mother Alta, sister Diva Heston, an infant brother, and brother Milton C. "Mert" Williams. She is survived by her daughter and son-in-law, Bonnie and Lyle Neville of Hutchinson, Kansas, her son and daughter-in-law, Tom and Kathy Coons of Montrose, Colorado, her brother, John T. "Jack" Williams of Hugo, Colorado, 8 grandchildren; Brad, Lane and Morgan Neville, Monee Enger, James T. Coons III, Cristi Whipp, and Amie and Brad Ranly, 7 great-grandchildren, numerous nieces, nephews, extended family and friends.
