Salina lawyer to serve on state supreme court

TOPEKA (AP) — For Salina attorney Lawton Nuss, appointment to the Kansas Supreme Court means a chance to do something for the state that his great-grandparents helped settle.

Nuss, 49, was named Wednesday to the state's highest court by Gov. Bill Graves. It's one of three positions on the seven-member court that Graves is expected to fill before leaving office in January.

"It is a special thrill to be able to do something for Kansas since my family has been here for so long," Nuss said.

His mother's grandparents settled outside Dodge City in the 1870s; his father's grandparents put down roots near Great Bend in the 1880s.

Authorities investigate deaths of nine buffalo

TONGANOXIE (AP) — Authorities are investigating whether neglect was involved in the deaths of nine buffalo in Leavenworth County.

The Leavenworth County Sheriff Department found several carcasses last week after receiving an anonymous tip about the dead animals near Tonganoxie. Initially authorities investigated because of the health and

As deputies walked through the pasture, they discovered the entire herd of 31 buffalo was emaciated. A veterinarian who plans to treat the surviving animals said Tuesday he thought a significant factor in the deaths was an internal parasite but neglect could be involved.
