# Sherman County youth to exhibit livestock

Six Sherman County youths will exhibit livestock at the 70th annual Kansas Junior Livestock Show Friday-Monday, Sept. 20-23, in Wichita.

Jace Mosbarger of Goodland will be showing a Maine-Anjou breeding heifer; John Mosbarger of Goodland will be showing two market steers; Chance Schilling of Edson will be showing a Limousin breeding heifer;

Clay Schilling of Edson is showing a Limousin breeding heifer and a Maine-Anjou breeding heifer; Garrett Taylor of Goodland is showing two market barrows; and Ryan Taylor of Goodland is showing two market barrows.

Scholarships are on the line as 724 4-H and Future Farmers of America members have entered 1,473 head of livestock in the show. The top five ani-

mals from each of the market divisions, steers, hogs and lambs, will sell during the auction of champions at 7 p.m. Monday.

The show will present \$12,000 in scholarships to exhibitors prior to the auctions. The money for scholarships comes from private contributions and income from the Beefeater Barbecue before the auction.

Exhibitors of cattle, sheep and swine are eligible for a separate showman-ship contest. The top showman in both the junior and senior divisions will receive a silver belt buckle.


