Sept. 21, 1902: Genuine Populist aspirants for office are pushed to the rear by plots. Democrats repudiate their agreement to share offices.

Sept. 22, 1902: A Fusion Party was formed and nominated their ticket. Nominations were open to both Democrat and Populist.
