Senior hurt in Cowboys' loss to St. Francis

After a run by Don Raymer and an incomplete pass, the Cowboys punted again.

After having its own struggle with the yellow flag, St. Francis followed up with an incomplete pass, but Michael Raile ran 40 yards for the touchdown. Kyle Buffington tacked on the twopoint conversion, putting the Indians up 16-0 with about six minutes to go

The Cowboys had rushing yardage from Brock Lohr, and freshman Bobby Miller recovered a Goodland fumble, but they had to punt again. Derrick Raymer dropped the ball when going back to punt. Goodland recovered, and it was called an unsuccessful fourth down conversion.

The Indians turned the ball over on downs with seconds to go in the half, but Goodland couldn't make it to the end zone, leaving the score at 16-0 St.
