

Brewster comes back to beat Sharon Springs

You can't count out the Brewster Bulldogs.

Down 14 points at halftime Friday night against Sharon Springs, they came back to win 38-34 in a back-and-forth slugfest on their home turf. The Bulldogs started out sluggish. The Wildcats were running all over their defense in the first half, and at one point the 'Dawgs were down 16-0. Brewster only had 18 total yards in the first half. Brewster finally took the lead in the third quarter, but lost it on a kick-off return touchdown on the next play. Both teams played tough until the last second, but it was the Bulldog players who would go home victorious. Sharon Springs drew first blood with a touchdown with 3:49 left in the first quarter. The Bulldogs' quarterback, Jacob Falcon, was sacked in the end zone at the start of the second quarter for a safety, and the Wildcats led 8-0. At 9:26 left in the half, Sharon Springs scored again, this time getting the two-point conversion and leading 16-0. Brewster couldn't get anywhere on their next drive and punted out of bounds at the Wildcats' 36. After a time-out, the Brewster defense stepped

up and not only held Sharon Springs, but drove the team back. After a slight rushing gain, the Wildcats lost 15-yards on a holding penalty. At third down with 25-yards to go, the Sharon Springs was again hit with a yellow flag, this time for offensive pass interference, and ended up at their own 20-yard line. Both teams called time-outs, and Sharon Springs punted.

The 'Dawgs returned it to the Wildcats' 24. Falcon rushed and was driven out of bounds at three yards out. Jarrett Carpenter ran on the next two plays and muscled his way through the Sharon Springs defense for Brewster's first score. Carpenter caught the two-point conversion, and cut the lead to 16-8. A Wildcat drive late in the half led to a touchdown reception, and Sharon

Springs led 22-8 with 45 seconds left. Jared Carpenter scored first in the second half, running in a touchdown with 6:18 left in the third quarter. He then found himself wide open in the end zone during the two-point conversion and brought the score to 22-16. Falcon tied it up on the third play of the fourth quarter. Sharon Springs kicked off, putting the ball into the end zone for a touchback, a practice they

followed most of the game. Once the ball was set up on the 15-yard line for the 'Dawgs, the quarterback, Falcon, rushed ten yards with it. On the next play, Falcon ran down the sideline, breaking through two concentrations of Wildcats and finished his 75-yard run past the goal line. The two-point conversion was good, and Brewster found itself up 24-22, its first lead of the night. Sharon Springs didn't sit still for long. On the Brewster kick-off, the Sharon Springs receiver dropped the ball, recovered and broke through the 'Dawgs for six points. The two-point conversion was no good; Carpenter intercepted the pass in the end zone. Finding themselves down 28-24, the Bulldogs started out at their 15-yard line after another touchback and worked themselves up to Sharon Spring's side of the field in one drive, 13 yards from the goal line. Their drive was hurt by five yards when an illegal procedure called against them, but they made it up in the next play when Falcon carried the ball and was forced out of bounds at 11-yards. Carpenter accepted a hand-off on the second down and put six on the board for Brewster. The Bulldogs were again

ahead, this time 30-28. The conversion attempt was no good. The Wildcats went through two incomplete passes, then saw their quarterback sacked by Carpenter with a six yard loss. Their punt went high and landed on about the 40-yard line. Brewster's Falcon picked it up and carried it in for a touchdown. Jake Long caught the conversion attempt and Brewster led 38-28 with seven minutes left. Sharon Springs scored on their next drive. On their first play of the possession, they gained 37 yards on a pass and ended up four yards out. Brewster held them for two plays, but a touchdown pass found its way through the 'Dawg defense with 3:37 left. On the conversion attempt, the quarterback was sacked 12 yards out. Both teams fought until the whistle sounded, but Brewster held the lead and won by four points. Sharon Springs led in total yardage with 256 while Brewster ended up with 219. Falcon led Brewster in rushing yards with 159 in 33 attempts. The 'Dawg's record is now 2-1, after beating Jennings in the previous game and losing to Tribune in the season opener. They next play Weskan at 7:30 Central Time Friday at their home field.

Brewster Bulldogs win one, lose one

The Brewster Bulldog volleyball team dropped a rare match to Dundy County, Neb. Saturday, 5-15 and 7-15, but dispatched Atwood 15-11, 15-6 at the Atwood Triangular. Coach Lynda McKee said that poor passing and low serve receive percentages were the key to the loss. "In order to run our offense effectively," she added, "we must have a good first pass." Brewster came back strong against Atwood. "Against Atwood," McKee said, "we played much better as a team. Our serve receive efficiency increased,

and therefore, so did our setting and hitting percentages." Sara Luckert led the Bulldog attack with 9 kills; Andrea Horney had 8, Miranda Starns also had 8, and Alicia Collett had notched six kills. Jalyn Reid recorded 15 assists and Caitlan Rush had 9. Luckert led the defense with 8 stuffs and 10 deflections, Collett had 7 stuffs and 7 deflections and Ashley Carpenter had 5 stuffs and 5 deflections. The Lady Bulldogs are now 14-2 and are in action tonight at Cheylin along with Golden Plains. On Tuesday, Oct. 1, the Lady Bulldogs are at home against Triplains.

Goodland places fourth in Denver tournament

The Cowgirls' volleyball team finished fourth out of 16 teams in a tournament Saturday in Denver. The girls were at Overland High School this weekend, a tournament Goodland has won twice in the last four years. This year the Cowgirls won all three matches of pool play, but lost twice in the brackets. Their first challenge was Bear Creek. The Cowgirls beat them 15-11 and 15-5. Woodland Park came up next and lost to Goodland 15-5 and 15-6. Aurora West was the Cowgirls' third opponent. Coach Jerry McKee said they were ranked second at the tournament and were undefeated up to that point. Goodland won 15-0 and 15-1. Coming out of the pool, Goodland was ranked third. They lost their first bracket match to Overland 11-15, 4-15, and the second to Chatfield 13-15 and 9-15, for fourth. Weld Central, the winning school, is ranked 30th in the nation, McKee said. mines how the team is seeded at substitute. While the varsity players were in Denver, the freshman girls played in Oberlin, finishing third. They won their pool play, McKee said, and lost their first match in the bracket. The volleyball players next play at 4 p.m. Thursday in Ulysses. Along with the host team, Holcomb and Liberal will be at the meet. McKee said Holcomb and Ulysses seem to have good teams this year, but he isn't sure about Liberal. "It's been quite a few years since we played them," he said. "We're looking forward to it."
