The World Series champion Arizona Diamondbacks clinched a playoff spot with Los Angeles' loss.

The Dodgers were held to just three hits in losing their third in a row and 10th in 17 games.

Los Angeles began the day two games behind San Francisco, which played at home against San Diego, for

the wild card. The Dodgers have only five games left.

Todd Zeile hit an RBI single in the first as Colorado won its fourth in a row.

The Rockies swept the Arizona Diamondbacks in a three-game weekend series.

Stark (11-3) continued his mastery of the Dodgers, improving to 2-0 in four games against them.

He gave up one hit — a single by Brian Jordan in the first — in seven innings.
