

# Cowgirls win twice, lose twice

The Cowgirls varsity volleyball team split their matches Saturday at an Oakley tournament, winning two and losing two, while the junior varsity won four matches to take the championship.

The varsity girls lost their first match to Grinnell 15-7, 9-15 and 15-13, before beating Wheatland 15-6 and 15-11. They lost to Colby 15-10, 15-4, then won their last match against Oakley 15-5 and 15-2.

The tournament drops the girls' record to 16-8. The Cowgirls had won their six previous matches.

"We just didn't play as well as we could have," coach Jerry McKee said. "There were things we could have done that we just didn't do."

The junior varsity girls not only won all their matches, they did it in only two sets each. They beat Grinnell 18-16 and 15-3, then they topped Wheatland 15-11 and 15-1. They beat Colby 15-8 and 15-10, then Oakley 15-6 and 15-2.

"The junior varsity played really well," McKee said. "It's impressive that they beat everyone in two."

McKee said all the girls got time on the floor, and the team is getting ready for post-season play.

"Sub-state is drawing near," he said. "We're working hard for it."

The other teams in Goodland's league are Colby, Scott City, Ulysses, Larned, Hugoton and Pratt. Last year the Cowgirls were eliminated by Scott City before the state tournament. On Saturday, Sept. 29, the girls traveled to Scott City and beat the team on their own turf in two sets.

Today, Goodland will play host to Oberlin and Atwood, starting at 3:30 p.m. at Max Jones Fieldhouse. Goodland's junior varsity and freshman teams will play Oberlin at 3:30 p.m. At 4:30 p.m. the Oberlin and Goodland varsity teams will battle, along with the Atwood and Goodland junior varsity and the Oberlin and Atwood freshmen. At 5:30 p.m., the Oberlin and Atwood varsity and junior varsity teams will compete, as well as the Goodland and Atwood freshmen. The Atwood and Goodland varsity teams will play at 6:30 p.m.

# Bulldog runners win medals

Brewster's first-year cross country runners are doing well for themselves, with three of five boys ending up in the top 10 at their last meet Tuesday, Oct. 1 in Oberlin.

In the boys' junior varsity, Mark Luckert, the team's only sophomore, earned a silver medal by finishing his three-mile run in 19 minutes 54 seconds. Karman Selby came in fourth with 20:22, Scott Carney seventh with 20:42, Jonathan Collett finished 31st

with 24:38 and Aaron Horinek 36th with 27:01. The boys came away with 80 points for the team.

On the girls' side, Sophomore Andrie Baird came in third in the junior varsity division, running two miles in 16:27. Senior Erin Carney had a time of 14:22, and finished 26th in the varsity division. The girls do not have enough team members for a team score.

The Bulldog runners competed in

Colby on Thursday, Sept. 26. Baird finished first in her division with 17:54, while Carney's time was 15:48. Selby had the fastest time for the Brewster boys, and earned fourth with 20:06. Luckert came in fifth with 20:16, Carney 10th with 21:48, Collett 11th with 21:49 and Horinek 20th with 25:32.

The team next runs at 4 p.m. Central Time Thursday in Dighton.

# Injured pitcher may start for Cardinals

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Woody Williams will probably get a shot at starting in the NL championship series for the St. Louis Cardinals after missing the division series with a pulled muscle in his left side.

Williams threw 20-25 pitches from the mound on Sunday, the day after the Cardinals wrapped up their first-round sweep of the Arizona Diamondbacks, and played catch on Monday. He could get a start as early as Game 2 of the NLCS on Thursday night against San Francisco, so the Cardinals can quickly find out if his injury has healed.

Williams hinted as much when he said there was no time for another

bullpen outing to get an update on his health.

Manager Tony La Russa said the team would wait until Wednesday, the morning of Game 1, before finalizing their roster for the second round of the playoffs.

The Cardinals will get to open the NLCS at home because the wild-card Giants eliminated Atlanta with a 3-1 victory Monday night.

"Probably the consensus on the team was it would be nice to stay at home for the next three or four days," starter Andy Benes said. "Either team was going to be very good. We're going to see good pitching and a good lineup."

La Russa indicated that Williams, 9-4 with a 2.53 ERA in 17 starts between stints on the disabled list for the side injury, had a better chance of being on the roster than third baseman Scott

# Brewster grabs victory at home

The Brewster High School Bulldog football team got back on the winning track Friday night with a 54-26 win over the visiting Triplains Vikings.

Both teams were 2-2 and looking to get above .500. Triplains was coming off a 54-0 loss to Grinnell and Brewster had been beaten by Weskan 52-20 the week before.

On their first drive both teams suffered from fumbles. Triplains dropped the ball on the second play of the game and Brewster fumbled in a fourth and 30 situation on their own 17, giving Triplains the ball on the Brewster 29. Four plays later the Vikings scored their first touchdown.

The two-point conversion failed, but the Vikings led 6-0. Their only lead was short-lived, however, as Sean Swanson returned the kick 75 yards for a touchdown. Brewster converted their two-point attempt, a pass from Jacob Falcon to Swanson, to take an 8-6 lead.

The next Triplains offensive drive was out after three plays and a punt and Brewster took over.

Joel Selby, Swanson and Falcon shared the running duties as the Bulldogs began a running game that would last the rest of the night. Brewster attempted only seven passes and completed two.

With a first down and goal situation at the one yard line, Selby crossed the goal line with 5:52 left in the first quarter. The conversion failed, and Brewster led 14-6.

Triplains came back in the air, getting some big plays, but taking some chances. The big play strategy backfired when Falcon intercepted a Triplains pass near the Brewster goal.

The 'Dawgs took over on their own 15, but two failed run attempts and a fumbled snap found them punting from their own 18.

Triplains took over on their own 36 and scored on the first play of the drive, putting them within two points with only 1:33 left in the quarter.

Brewster's offense sputtered, but managed one first down before being forced to punt from their own 28. The defense stepped up with Jake Long stealing the ball from a receiver and giving the Bulldogs a first and 10 on the Triplains 31.

Two plays later, Falcon ran into the end zone, and then threw to Jarrett Carpenter for the two-point play, giving Brewster a 22-12 lead.

On the next drive, the Brewster offense put together a 79 yard 11 play drive which led to another Falcon touchdown with 1:36 left in the half. The two-point conversion failed, and Brewster led 28-12.

Triplains, next drive ended in an-

other interception. This time Long took the ball from the Brewster two all the way to the end zone. The Bulldogs led 34-12 at the end of the half.

Brewster took over in the second half on their own 38. Three plays later, on third and five at the Triplains 37, Falcon ran around the left side and into the end zone. He found Swanson for the conversion and the 'Dawgs led 42-12.

One their next possession, Brewster had another clock-eating running drive, ending with a Branson Gilley run from the Triplains 11. The two-point failed and Brewster led 48-12.

Triplains finally got back on the boards with a solid drive from their own 28, scoring after six plays with 3:49 left in the third period.

Brewster came right back to make the score 54-20 after a nine play drive from their own 25.

Neither team was able to move the ball on subsequent drives until Triplains got possession with 5:29 left in the game. They scored on a 69-yard pass.

Brewster had 314 yards on the ground and 31 in the air. Falcon went 2-7 for all 31 yards. Swanson had one reception for five yards and Carpenter had one for 19. Falcon had 129 yards on 14 carries, three touchdowns and a six yard kick return.

Swanson had 72 yards on 15 carries with a touchdown and 123 yards and one touchdown on three kick returns. Selby had 62 yards on 10 carries and a touchdown. Branson Gilley had 36 yards on six carries and a touchdown. Ryan had five yards on six carries and one touchdown. Long had 21 yards on six carries. Paul Flanders gained three yards on one carry.

Swanson had 17 tackles, four sacks and a fumble recovery. Long had eight tackles, two interceptions and a fumble recovery. Moore had five tackles, a sack and a fumble recovery.

Carpenter had four tackles, a sack, an interception and a fumble recovery. Aaron Smith had three tackles and two sacks. Crumrine had three tackles, a sack and shared a fumble recovery.

Tyler Johnson had three tackles. Ryan had two tackles and an interception. Falcon had two tackles and an interception. Selby had two tackles. Garrett Smith, Gilley and Flanders had a tackle each.

The Bulldogs homecoming game will be Friday. They face Healy at 7:30 p.m. Central Time.
