# Goodland has five all-league runners

## Speedy wins individual championship

Three Cowboy and two Cowgirl cross country runners finished in the top 10 at the Northwest Kansas League meet Saturday at Colby.

Speedy Aguilar won the individual league championship in the boys division with a time of 18:02 for the run.

"He just left them all behind," said Coach Don Smith. "The last time we had a league champion was two years ago and Speedy was second."

Coach Smith said the whole team did very well, and that Daniel Blake had been sick earlier in the week, but had been able to run and finished eighth to qualify as an all-league runner. His time was 19:01.

Timothy Kafka finished 10th in 19:11, and Coach Smith said he had to out race someone in the last 50 yards to get all-league honors.

"He finished 11th last year," Coach Smith said. "His goal was to make all-league."

"They all worked hard this year," Smith said. "They are a fine group to work with."

Smith said the team might have had a chance to win the league title, but Aaron Gittinger was unable to run which hurt because he has been one of the top runners this season.

Craig Mason was 20th at 20:07;

Brandon Zelfer was 22nd, 20:41; Zach Breininger was 24th, 22:04; and Charles Lammers was 28th, 26:09.

"We have a good core of people for next year, but we need more to make it easier during the season," Smith said. "We needed everybody to run to be able to have a team, and we had some who ran even though they were not feeling great to help the team."

Colby won the league title with 39 points; Quinter was second at 40; Goodland was third with 57; and Oberlin was fourth at 93. Neither Hoxie or Oakley had enough runners for a team score.

For the Cowgirls Tiffany Thomas and Deanna Livengood were all-league with Thomas finishing fifth and Livengood ninth.

Coach Smith said Thomas did very well, and he thought it was one of her best runs of the season with a time of 13:45.

For Livengood, Smith said this is her second year as an all-league runner, and she had a time of 14:08.

Chelsea Ontiveroz was just out of the all-league level finishing 12th with a time of 14:58. Coach Smith said she has been improving all season.

Wendy Keith was 15th at 15:57 and Kristen Lammers was 24th at 19:48.

Smith said the girls ran well, and he was proud of their effort.

"We would have had a chance to win the girls division," Smith said, "if we had been able to count Kalie Smith from Sharon Springs who finished seventh, but under the league rules they were not eligible for team score or league medals."

Smith finished with a time of 13:47. Charlie Short, a second year runner from Sharon Springs was unable to complete the race because of leg cramps.

Jessica Stephans of Colby won the individual league championship with a time of 12:51.

Colby won the league team title with 22 points. Oakley was second with 53 and Goodland was third with 57. Oberlin, Quinter and Hoxie did not have enough runners for a team score.

The Cowboys and Cowgirls will head to Larned Saturday for the regional meet.

Coach Smith said he thinks the boys, especially Speedy, have a chance to qualify for the state meet. The boys will have enough for a team score, but the girls will only have four runners who will be running individually.

"I think Speedy has a good chance to move on to the state meet," Coach Smith said. "It is always interesting because one never knows who will decide they want to make it to state and will have the best run of the season."

# Brewster falls to Grinnell, 50-0

The Brewster High School Bulldog football team took their third loss of the season to the Grinnell Warriors Friday night, 50-0 in Grinnell.

Grinnell opened the game with an eight play, 56 yard drive and scored again on the next four possessions.

Brewster's offense was unable to get on track as the Warriors, dominated the line of scrimmage.

Early in the second quarter, Grinnell's fifth drive was stopped after Jarrett Carpenter recovered a fumble at the Warriors, 33, but the Dawgs went out after four plays. Grinnell

scored again on the next possession and ended the half with a 38-0 lead.

The third quarter found Grinnell struggling to find the end zone, but still dominating the line of scrimmage and keeping Brewster at midfield. The warriors scored with 11:52 left in the fourth, but were unable to convert, then scored again at the 11:04 mark, ending the game on the 45-point rule.

The Dawgs had only 113 yards of total offense, with 96 on the ground. Jacob Falcon went 1-for-8 passing for seventeen yards to Sean Swanson.

Falcon also had 49 yards rushing on 19 carries. Swanson had 23 on seven carries; Joel Selby had 20 on five car-

ries, Jarrett Carpenter had one five yard carry, Jake Long carried once for two yards and Branson Gilley had minus three yards on two carries.

Defensively, Moore had 13 tackles, Swanson had 12, Falcon had eight Long had 10, Carpenter had nine, a fumble recovery and a sack. Jesse Crummire had nine tackles, and Aaron Smith had six.

Tyler Johnson and Josh Ryan had two each and Cory Grantz and Selby had one each.

The Bulldogs face another tough opponent Friday night when they face the Golden Plains Bulldogs in a cross-county rivalry. Game time in Brewster is 7:30 p.m.
