

# Wallace County Foundation to sell tax credits

Wallace County Foundation has been awarded the privilege of selling tax credits to taxpayers in the area. The Community Service Tax Credit program is the economic development arm of the Kansas Department of Commerce and Housing.

This organization has awarded the foundation \$59,850 in actual tax credits which will raise a total of \$85,545 for the purpose of renovating the Strand Theater in Sharon Springs.

The goal for the theater includes: rewiring, handicapped accessible

restroom, security and exit doors, a moveable screen to accommodate various productions, stage curtains, updating heating and cooling, acoustical treatment of walls, updating sound system, relocating the concession area, insulation to exterior walls and the addition of cupholders to the chairs.

Since 1966 the State of Kansas has implemented the tax credit program to encourage economic development on a local basis.

Instead of sending state taxes to the

state, one can use those dollars to donate locally.

The purpose of these tax credits is to substantially reduce the after-tax cost of making a donation to a charitable cause.

Here is an example of how the program works: a business or individual donates \$1,000 to the Wallace County Foundation on behalf of the Strand Theater project.

Seventy percent of the donation, or \$700, is eligible for Kansas Tax Credit on your Kansas Income Tax return. So,

instead of a taxpayer sending the taxes owed, to the state, he can use those dollars to donate locally for renovations to the Strand Theater.

Credits may be applied to tax due or refunded. If you are eligible to itemize on your federal return an additional savings would be realized.

The foundation encourages anyone interested in participating in this program to speak with his tax preparer and/or financial advisor. For some, it is an easy and efficient way to donate to a local project with 70 percent of

their donations returned to them in tax credits; for others it is a great benefit financially.

Tax credits are available through the Wallace County Foundation beginning July 1, 2002, through Dec. 31, 2003.

sides. Several of the board members thought it should say Sherman County and that Goodland could be worked into the triangle. The board decided to have Yonkey do some additional versions and Patty Eckhardt was to contact Carolyn Applegate to get her ideas.

Michelle Nemechek appeared to get a signature to turn the operating grant application into the Resource Conservation and Development group who have agreed to be the conduit on this grant. The board approved having Reid

sign the papers to move the grant forward.

Discussed phone and office equipment needs for the office. Board member John Garcia said Applegate had come to his business and looked at a desk and a couple of 2-drawer filing cabinets.

He estimated the cost of these at \$625 for the desk and \$199 each for the oak filing cabinets. Board member Harlan House said he thought it should be up to Applegate and that she has a budget of \$4,000 for all the office equipment. He made a motion to give

her permission to proceed to purchase the equipment within the budget.

Treasurer Kim Bohme said the current balance is \$29,812, and that the county will be giving them an additional \$18,000 in December.

She did not have any bills to present at this time, but explained how they had to be approved and then a purchase order gotten from the county clerk before they can be processed and paid.
