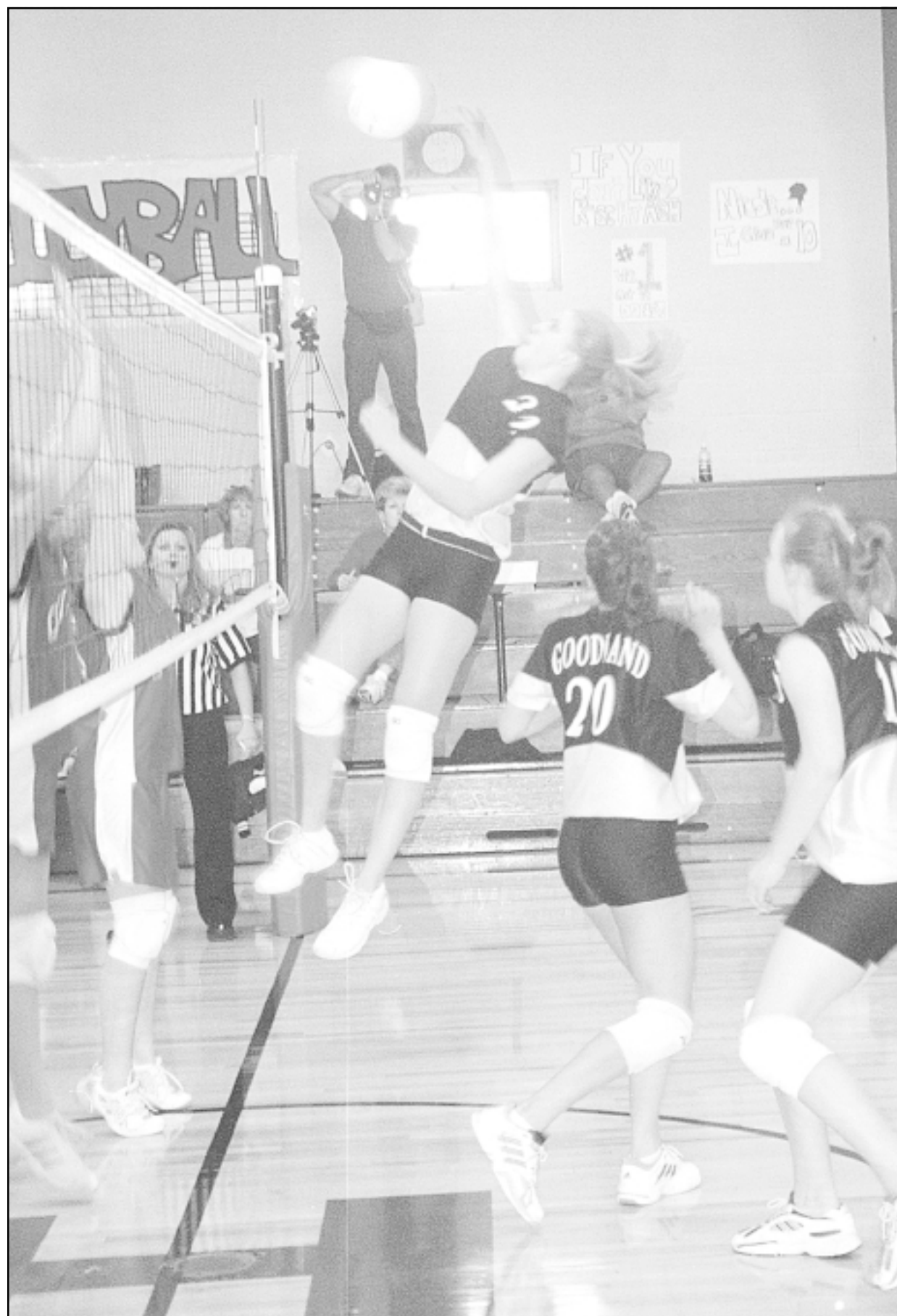

Loss to Colby ends Cowgirls string

The Cowgirls ended the string of league championships they held for five years Saturday when they lost to the Colby Lady Eagles in the semi-finals.

Coach Jerry McKee said the girls did not play as well as they could have in the pool play where they were 2-1 with wins over Hoxie and Quinter before falling to Oberlin.

The Hoxie match was close with the Cowgirls winning 15-12, 15-13. Against Quinter they won 15-1, 17-15.

The Lady Red Devils defeated the Cowgirls in two straight games 15-10 and 15-11.

With the loss the Cowgirls were the number two team out of their pool and Colby was the number one from the other pool.

The Cowgirls won the first game 15-10, but then lost 15-8 and the final was a 17-15 loss.

That knocked the Cowgirls out and

ended their tournament play.

Coach McKee said the girls were not playing up to their best performance.

It is possible they were looking forward to the Class 4A sub-state tournament which is Saturday at Pratt Community College.

The Cowgirls (23-10) will face Pratt (5-23) in the first round at 3 p.m. as the third seed in the tournament.

The top seed is Colby (26-3) and will have a bye in the first round. They will take on the winner of the Hugoton (18-16) vs. Ulysses (13-16) game. The second round game will be held at 4 p.m.

If Goodland wins the first match they will face the winner of the Scott City (28-8) and Larned (3-26) match at 5 p.m.

The championship game will be at 6 p.m.

The Cowgirls will have to go through Scott City and Colby to win the sub-state tournament and advance to the Class 4A state tournament.

Vermeil not worried about coaching legacy

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Asked if he might extend his three-year contract with Kansas City, coach Dick Vermeil's answer is quick and to the point.

"No."

It's not surprising that Vermeil, 66, will not be interested in going beyond 2003. If the Chiefs can't find a cure for a terrible defense in the next 12 months, a wonderful coaching legacy could be in trouble of falling with a thud.

Until he got here, Vermeil's career was an unbroken string of success. His UCLA team beat top-ranked Ohio State in the Rose Bowl, then he coached Philadelphia to the Super Bowl and took St. Louis to the Super Bowl championship.

Hailed as one of the coaching fra-

ternity's most respected elder statesmen, the likable wine connoisseur and his wife of more than 40 years retired to a beautiful home in the Pennsylvania woodlands.

But 21 months ago he let his old friend, Chiefs president Carl Peterson, talk him out of retirement. His three-year, \$10 million contract provided financial security.

But it is coming at a steep price.

He finds himself with perhaps one of the finest offenses and definitely the worst defense in the league, with a 3-4 record and a two-game skid after losing double-digit leads two weeks in a row in the fourth quarter.

After a 37-34 overtime loss to Denver Sunday, he is in no mood to think about coaching one day more than he has to.
