

Speedy finished 21st at state; Smith is 43rd

Goodland's Speedy Aguilar finished 21st in the Class 4A state cross country championship at Wamego Saturday, and Kalie Smith, running for Sharon Springs, finished 43rd in the girls 1A-2A race.

It was cold Saturday as the runners headed out, with the temperature around 36 degrees and a light wind of 5 mph.

Speedy ran the three miles in 17:14 for his best time of the year. He beat his previous best, which was at the regional meet in Larned, by one second. He missed being all-state by one place. He ran the first mile in 5:22, the second in 5:52 and the final mile in a flat 6 minutes.

Daniel Simon of Andale was the individual champion at 16:02. Baldwin was the team winner with 84 points; Clearwater second, 102; Tonganoxie third, 125; Anderson County fourth, 144; Hugoton fifth, 149; Pratt sixth, 171; Independence seventh, 176; Mill

Valley eighth, 178; El Dorado ninth, 189; and Wamego 10th, 203.

This was Aguilar's first trip to the state meet, as he finished out of the running at the 4A regional meet last year. Last year at the Northwest Kansas League tournament, Aguilar came in third with a time of 17:58.

Smith, who has run with the Cowgirls through the season, was at her first state meet in the 1A-2A championship and came in 43rd with a time of 13:43.

She had finished ninth at the Class 2-1A regional meet with 13:29.

Michelle Stueve of Olpe was the individual champion at 12:02. Hutch Trinity won the 1A-2A team competition with 85 points; Osborne was second, 90; Syracuse third, 121; Peabody-Burns fourth, 122; Sacred Heart fifth, 130; Olpe sixth, 157; Horton seventh, 172; Wakefield eighth, 193; McLouth ninth, 198; and Stanton County 10th, 204.

Cowboys face Eagles in Kingman Tuesday

The Cowboys got some hard work in during a special practice Sunday in preparation for their trip to Kingman on Tuesday, where they will play the Eagles at 6 p.m. in the bi-district round of the Class 4A state football playoffs.

The Cowboys, who didn't win a game last year, have made huge strides this time, ending the regular season with a record of 5-4 and advancing to the playoffs with a 2-1 district record. Scott City, the 3-0 district champion with a total record of 8-1, will play Hugoton at home on Tuesday.

The Cowboys will travel more than 260 miles to play Kingman, which finished No. 1 in District No. 15 after defeating Hugoton 14-0 on Thursday.

Coach Tony Diehl said the Cowboys can't dwell on the loss to Scott City in the final district game Thursday.

"We don't have time to stay down very long," he said.

He said he expects the Cowboys to be in good form for the game, and believes they have a good chance to win if the defense can hold Kingman in check and the offense plays at its best and doesn't make mistakes.
