

# Blackshirts win 7th all-star match

A crowd of 370 watched 24 senior all-stars battle through five games at Max Jones Fieldhouse Saturday afternoon in the seventh annual Northwest Kansas Volleyball All-Star game.

The girls were from high schools all over the area, and were divided into two teams. The match featured a best-of-five series. After splitting the first four games, the teams settled down to settle the match in the fifth.

The Blackshirts, including Colleen Koehler and Stephanie Fairbanks from Goodland, won the first game, 30-24, but the Whiteshirts, including Sara Luckert, Kristy Jamison and Alicia Collett of Brewster, took the second, 30-26, before the break.

The Whiteshirts then took the third game handily, 30-22, leading by as many as 10 points. The Blackshirts made a run, but were unable to close the gap.

The games were played by college rules, plus points were awarded on side outs. The winning team in each of the four games had to score 30 points.

In the fourth game, the Blackshirts took an early lead, but the Whiteshirts wouldn't go quietly and kept creeping up. However, the Blackshirts were able to prevail, 30-23, to tie the match at two games each.

The fifth game was to be played to 20 points. The lead changed several times in the early going, but finally the Blackshirts started to develop a lead. They were able to extend the margin about halfway through the game, and scored the final three points to win the game and match, 20-13.

The final points was served by

Goodland's Colleen Koehler, who was one of two Cowgirls playing on the black squad. The other Cowgirl was Stephanie Fairbanks, who served the opening points for the match.

At the end of the match Shannon Lowry of Atwood was presented the Most Inspirational Player award and a \$100 scholarship to the college of her choice. She was chosen by her fellow players.

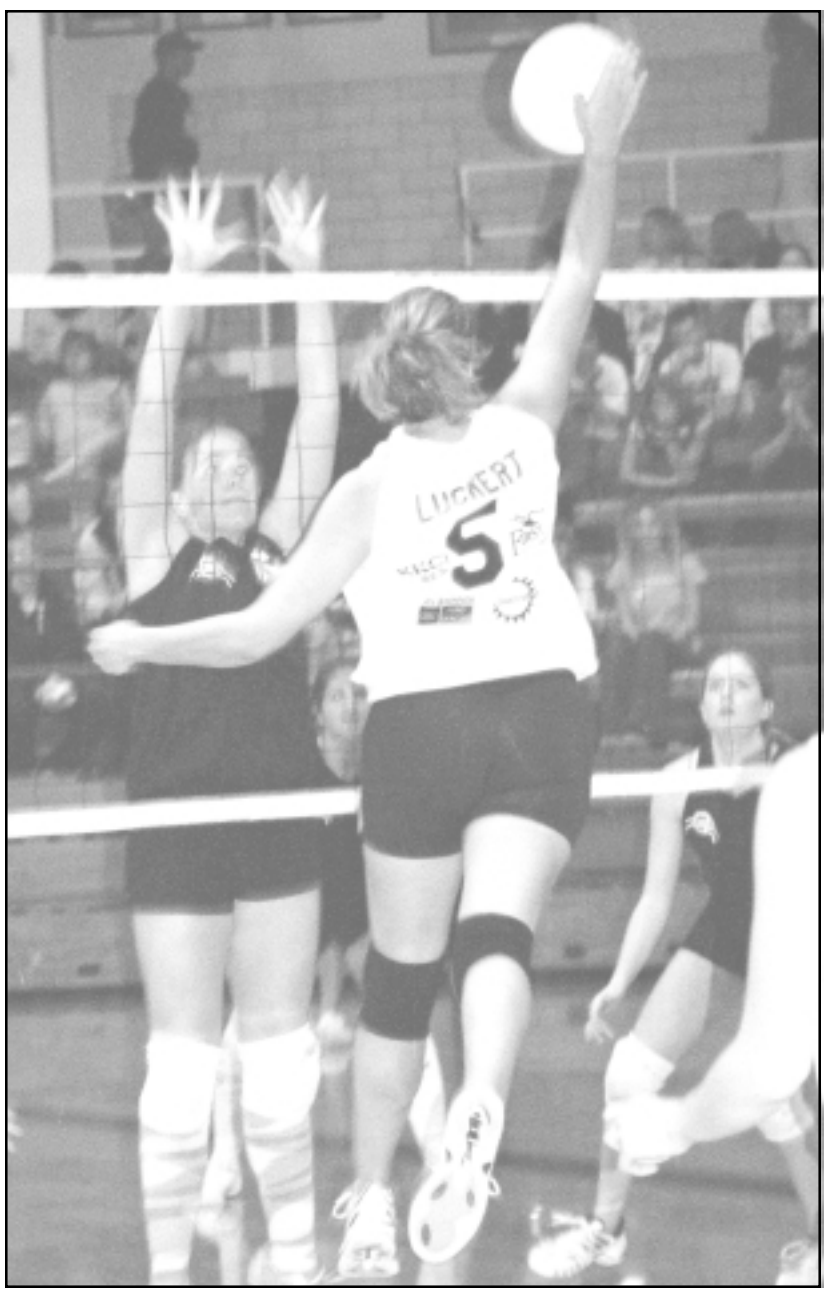

Coaching the Whiteshirts were Kyle Carroll of Scott City and Deb Beougher of Winona.

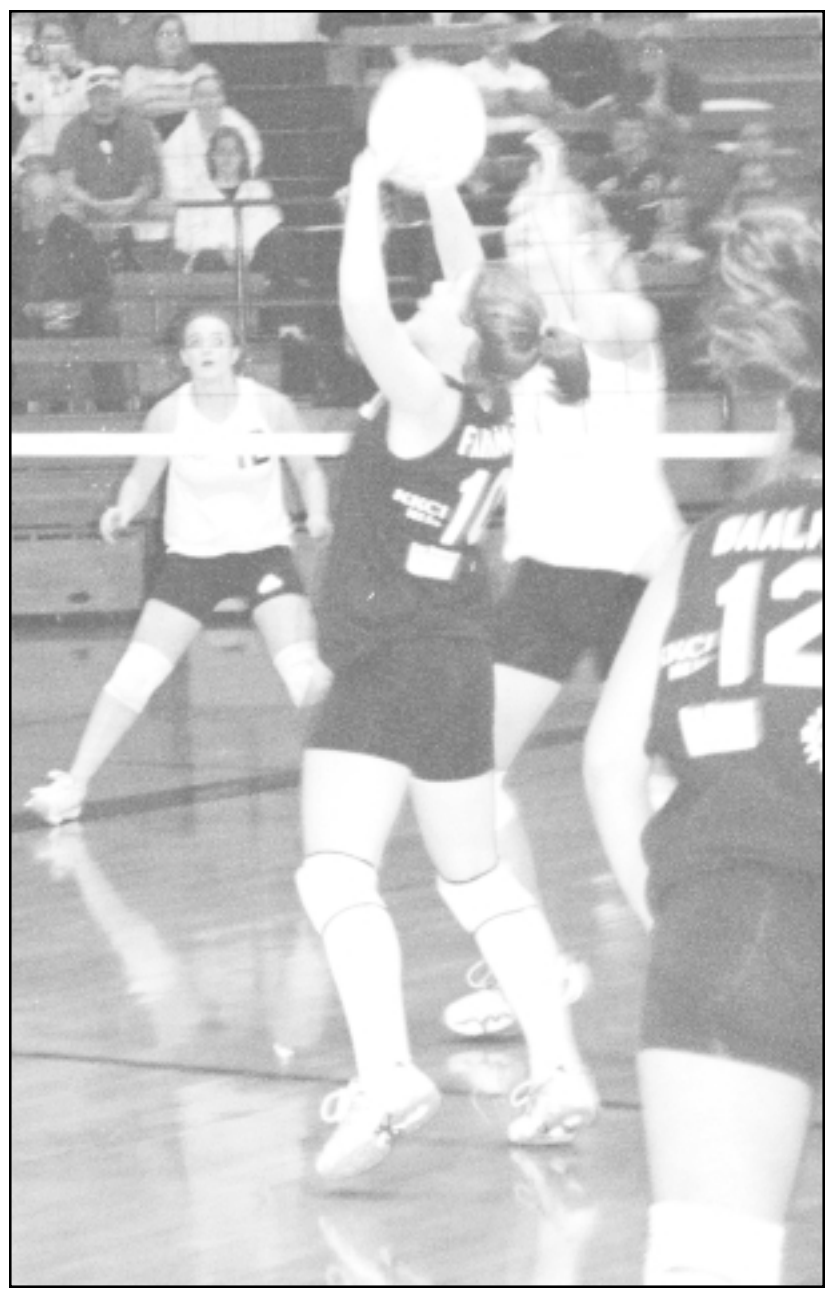

# Lady Mustangs second in league volleyball

The Goodland Mustangs lost to Colby for the championship in the Eighth grade girls league volleyball tournament held at Goodland on Oct. 24.

The Lady Mustangs beat St. Francis in the opening round, 15-4, 15-10; and then beat Oakley in the semi-finals, 15-7, 7-15 and 15-10 to reach the championship match.

In the championship the Mustangs fell to Colby, 9-15, 15-13 and 15-8.

The A team finished the season with a 13-1 record and the B team had a 7-5 record.

The leading scorer for the Mustangs in the St. Francis game were Amber Cowan and Emily Murray who each had 7 points. In the Oakley game it was

Dani Bedore and Murray with 7 each. In the Colby match Ashley Cebula had 12, Whitney Archer 5 and Bedore 5.

The other first round matches were: Oakley over Atwood, 15-6, 11-15, 15-5; Colby over Oberlin, 15-2, 15-13; Quinter over Hoxie, 4-15, 15-10 and 15-4.

In the consolation matches Atwood beat St. Francis, 18-16, 15-13; Hoxie beat Oberlin, 16-14, 7-15, 15-7; Oberlin beat St. Francis, 6-15, 15-2, 15-9; and Hoxie beat Atwood, 16-14, 2-15 and 15-11.

In the semi finals Colby beat Quinter, 15-7 and 15-1 to face Goodland for the championship.

Oakley beat Quinter, 15-8 and 15-12, in the third place match.
