

# Kansas Coach Mangino getting right into recruiting

LAWRENCE (AP) — It seems only fair the worst team in the Big 12 should get a week's head start in the recruiting race.

The Kansas Jayhawks finished 2-10 overall and 0-8 in the conference, the only Big 12 team without at least one league win. But, in a quirk of scheduling, they also ended their season at least a week ahead of everybody else.

So now first-year head coach Mark Mangino and his staff are off and recruiting, searching for the kind of athletes able to compete with the Big 12 teams that routinely pounded the 2002 Jayhawks.

It's the unintended reward of a schedule that had them play 12 weeks straight without a week off.

"That's the silver lining in it," Mangino said. "We're going to take two evaluation days this week and we're going to take two next week. We've got coaches going all over the country, getting into their geographical areas. We're having four recruiting weekends in the next five weekends. And at this point in time we're on some really quality kids."

The Jayhawks need lots of quality kids to start catching up with other league programs. There were a few encouraging signs, to be sure, in an otherwise dismal year. Junior quarterback Bill Whittemore proved himself,

but a poor offensive line couldn't keep him from getting beaten up game after game. He finally got hurt so badly against Missouri he had to miss the Jayhawks' final three games.

Mangino devoted much of the year to player development. Six first-year freshmen got considerable playing time. Twenty of the two-deep on offense and defense were either freshmen or sophomores, including running back Clark Green, perhaps their most impressive youngster.

Another promising freshman was Nick Reid, a starting outside linebacker who offered this assessment of his first year as a college football player.

"There's only one place for us to go and that's up," Reid said.

Nevertheless, it was the seventh straight losing season for the Jayhawks, whose only victories were over Tulsa and Division I-AA Southwest Missouri State.

It was the second year in a row Kansas did not have a conference victory at home.

Mangino, who helped Bill Snyder build Kansas State into a winner, insists he's never felt daunted by the task ahead.

"I like doing this job. There are challenges every day, but I'm ready for them," Mangino said. "Shoot, I don't like losing, but I see the big picture.

We're going to build this program. We're going to make it competitive in the Big 12."

Mangino does not expect any shuffling of his staff.

"I'm not planning any changes," Mangino said. "Everybody who's with us hopefully will be back. But I can't control career opportunities. It's like coach (Bill) Snyder always used to say, you've got to do what's best for your career and what's best for your families. And that's what I tell our guys."

As far as the kind of players he's trying to recruit, Mangino said flexibility will be key.

"We'd all like to have a 6-foot-5, 300-pound center who can move," Mangino said. "But if a guy shows toughness, he plays with leverage, he uses his hands well, we'll take a 6-1 or 6-2 center. I won a lot of games with 6-1, 6-2 centers. You're looking for all these variables. But one of the things we don't want to do is just take players just to take a chance."

Mangino knew it would be a long time before he could get the Jayhawks competitive with, say, Kansas State, which this year beat Kansas by the most lopsided margin in the long history of the rivalry.

"It's been a long season," freshman receiver Mark Simmons said. "But you have to think better times are coming."

# Spread offense far from dead, Oklahoma Coach Stoops says

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) — Back when he was coaching at Oklahoma, Barry Switzer was asked during one of his weekly news conferences about the challenge of facing Nebraska's option offense.

"It's not the alignment," Switzer said, "it's the alignments."

Current Oklahoma coach Bob Stoops is saying the same thing about Texas Tech and its spread offense.

The Red Raiders have passed their previous three opponents silly, winning all three games to get to No. 24 in the country and within one victory of the Big 12 South title.

Stoops says the success enjoyed by Texas Tech coach Mike Leach is proof that the spread offense is alive and well.

"I think it's a testament to Mike sticking to his guns," he said. "When all the reporters and everybody out there was wanting to say the spread offense is finished, everyone's caught onto it, he's proven that wrong."

"I say it a lot — everybody has a different system and they're all good. I think it always gets down to executing. It still gets down to how you play and how they play."

Leach brings the Red Raiders to Norman on Saturday night, with the Big 12 South title going to the winner. He used this offense at Oklahoma in 1999 as the Sooners' offensive coordinator.

With Josh Heupel at quarterback,

Oklahoma went 7-5 to end a string of five straight nonwinning seasons.

Leach then left to take the Texas Tech job and Stoops began pressing for a better ground game. This year, the Sooners have a 1,000-yard rusher in Quentin Griffin.

Texas Tech (8-4, 5-2 Big 12) makes no pretenses about how it will attack. Kliff Kingsbury threw 60 passes in a 42-38 victory over Texas last week and is averaging 53 passes per game.

Stoops said Leach has made only minor changes to the offense during his three years in Lubbock.

"What you see, though, is a number of years with the quarterback and receivers together," he said. "They believe and know their system well, just from doing it over and over now."

Kingsbury, in his fourth year as Tech's quarterback, is No. 4 on the NCAA Division I career passing chart with 11,867 yards.

He has thrown for 4,455 yards and 41 touchdowns this season, with only 10 interceptions in 634 attempts. He had 473 yards and six TDs in the upset of Texas last week.

"There's nothing that he hasn't seen, probably a couple times," said co-defensive coordinator Mike Stoops. "He's just so familiar with what they do."

Fourth-ranked Oklahoma (9-1, 5-1) is familiar with Tech as well. The Sooners have gotten the better of the Red Raiders each year that Leach has been

coach, winning 27-13 in 2000 and 30-13 last year.

The difference this week, Bob Stoops said, will boil down to which team makes more plays.

"We have played very good defense the last two years we've played them," he said. We've been in the right spots, broke on the ball well, challenged receivers, blitzed well and got pressure.

"But every year you have to earn it again. We don't take it for granted that everything just stays the same. We've got to go be on top of our game and be able to do that again, and our players understand that."
