Leftover seeds can be stored for next year's garden

If you have some leftover seed from this year's garden, there is no reason you can't save it for next year.

With a few exceptions, there is no reason garden seeds can't be stored for three to five years with little loss of viability or quality if properly handled. If it is simply a matter of saving some seeds from this year to use next year, they can be stored without going to much extra effort.

However, if you are planning to buy large quantities for use every year for the next four to five years, some special storage conditions must be met.

The enemies of stored seeds are humidity and heat. Getting seeds properly dried and storing them in a cool, dry location is essential if they are to be the better.

Seeds can be kept in a cool basement or in the refrigerator. If the temperature remains below 40 degrees Fahrenheit, seeds can be held for a long time. If 40 degrees is not possible, then the cooler




