

Israeli's shoot rock throwing boy around the world

NABLUS, West Bank) — Israeli troops shot dead an 8-year-old Palestinian boy in Nablus today as hundreds of youths ignored a curfew and left their homes to attend school and throw stones at soldiers, Palestinian witnesses and hospital officials said.

The children gathered in the center of the city, hurling stones at an army jeep, witnesses said. The soldiers opened fire, killing Jihad Faqeh, an 8-year-old boy, hospital officials said. Witnesses said he had been standing in a side alley. The Israeli army said it was checking the report.

Hundreds of other residents of the largest West Bank commercial center ventured out onto the streets, violating the curfew, to buy goods to prepare the evening meal that breaks the daylong fast during the holy month of Ramadan.

Observant Muslims don't eat, drink, smoke or have sex during daylight hours throughout Ramadan. Large dinners just after sundown are the norm.

In the West Bank town of Bethlehem, the Israeli army pulled its troops out of the center of Bethlehem, and Palestinian residents ventured out of their homes for the first time since last week. But the army said there was no formal withdrawal, and soldiers and their armored vehicles remained nearby.

VIENNA, Austria — Austria's far right suffered crushing losses in general elections, but the party led by Joerg Haider still stood a good chance of renewing its governing coalition with the conservatives following that party's overwhelming win.

The conservative People's Party of Chancellor Wolfgang Schuessel won over 42 percent of the vote in Sunday's elections, according to preliminary results released by the Interior Ministry.

The Social Democrats, the strongest party in the elections in 1999, received just under 37 percent of the vote, and the environmentalist Greens came fourth at 9 percent. Haider's anti-immigrant Freedom Party received just over 10 percent, compared to nearly 27 percent in the last election.

"Breathtaking," said Schuessel of his party's win. He refused to be drawn on his choice of coalition partners, saying he would enter talks with all other major parties.

Still, with political differences great and mutual suspicions strong between the opposition Greens and the People's Party, a renewed coalition between Schuessel's conservatives and Haider's Freedom Party appeared the most likely option.

SAN FRANCISCO — A tentative contract reached by longshoremen and shipping lines on the West Coast appears to be a harbinger of labor peace following a crippling lockout and weeks of bitter negotiations.

The pact comes nearly two months after the start of a lockout that caused cargo to pile up at West Coast ports and cost the fragile economy billions of dollars. The 10-day shutdown ended only after the president intervened, sending talks into mediation.

Late Saturday, officials hammered out a tentative agreement that many believe will win final approval from a majority of the 10,500 rank-and-file union members, who will probably vote in early January.

The six-year deal would provide substantial wage and benefit improvements for union members, plus technology and dispute-resolution improvements that the companies wanted, said Peter Hurtgen, head of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service.

Hurtgen said he would be surprised if union members didn't approve the deal.

said Kenneth Bowersox, the astronaut who will take over as the next space station commander.

Bowersox and the six others aboard Endeavour were expected to arrive at the space station this afternoon, ending a two-day chase. Astronaut Donald Pettit and Russian Nikolai Budarin will join Bowersox on the station.

After training for five years for a four-month space station stint, Bowersox said it was hard to believe he was finally on his way.

"I can't wait," he said in an interview with The Associated Press on Sunday night. "I've seen two or three sunrises during the last couple days and I can't believe how many more I've got ahead of me. But I think every day is going to be precious up here."

Endeavour should have flown in October, but was grounded because of cracked fuel lines found throughout the shuttle fleet. Then Endeavour ran into other trouble that delayed liftoff.

"It gave me an opportunity to try to put on a few pounds before flight," Pettit said. "So I did a lot of eating. And then I did a lot more sleep after that. And then, of course, we have to go to the gym."

NEWTON, Mass. — Monsignor Michael Smith Foster made an emotional return to his former parish Sunday for the first time since he was cleared of child sexual abuse allegations.

"By your prayers you clothed my spirit. By your concern through letters and calls and action you welcomed me into your lives when I felt like I had been cast into prison," he said.

Foster was one of the highest ranking clergy members accused of abuse since the crisis erupted in January, when court documents revealed that the archdiocese shuffled abusive priests between parishes. He is the presiding judge of the archdiocesan tribunal that handles annulments and canon law issues.

The Mass at Sacred Heart church was packed with those who steadfastly supported the priest when he was accused of sexual abuse and twice suspended before being reinstated last month.

As he made his way up the aisle toward the altar, shaking hands and greeting parishioners, the congrega-

tion broke out in applause for about 30 seconds.

The archdiocese is "delighted" to have Foster back in full ministry, said spokeswoman Donna Morrissey. "We're going to work together to make sure we maintain and respect his good name," she said.

WASHINGTON — President Bush is launching the biggest government reorganization in more than 50 years, signing legislation creating a new Department of Homeland Security.

Bush was naming current homeland security chief Tom Ridge to head the department and Navy Secretary Gordon England to be his deputy at the bill-signing ceremony today.

The new Cabinet department — an idea Bush initially opposed — will swallow existing 22 agencies with combined budgets of about \$40 billion and employ 170,000 workers, the most sweeping federal reorganization since the Defense Department's birth in 1947.

Bush proposed the new department last June, saying it was needed to provide a united front against the terrorist threat to the nation.


WASHINGTON — President Bush's twin daughters, who have had brushes with the law for underage drinking, turned 21 on Monday with an aim to stay clear of the spotlight.

Both Barbara Bush, who attends Yale University, and Jenna Bush, a student at the University of Texas at Austin, were in their home state of Texas in advance of a Thanksgiving family celebration. The president and first lady Laura Bush planned to celebrate the twins' birthdays during the holiday weekend, a White House official said.

Mrs. Bush was returning to Texas today and heading to the family ranch in Crawford on Tuesday. The president is to follow on Wednesday.

The White House is fiercely protective of the twins' privacy, and officials refused to provide details about the birthday observances.
