## today in history

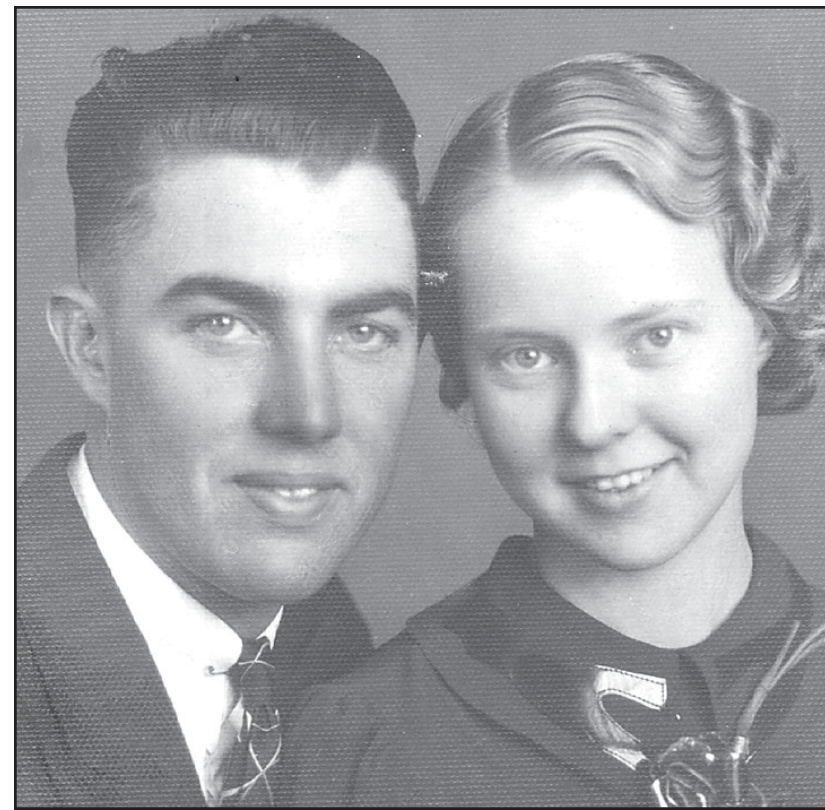
