

Trash system discussion continues

Discussions are continuing between the city and the county about the consolidation of the trash collection system, and Wednesday the county commissioners will be brought up to date by Commissioner Kevin Rasure.

The Sherman County Economic Development Council has been working with the city and the county about keeping the trash collection system in

the county, and the city commission and the county commissioners have agreed to continue the process.

The two commissions hope to make a final decision about the trash collection system by the middle of December.

The county commissioners also will consider an elevator maintenance agreement for the Good Samaritan

Center, and county health insurance costs.

- Renewal of the city-county recreation agreement.
- Discussion of the recycling project and need for more containers.
- Questions from Ron Vignery and Vernon Isaac about a county road.
- Kim Bohme about a petty cash fund for Sherman County Economic Development.
- Carolyn Applegate, economic development director, for an executive session for a personnel matter.
- Doug Jackson is to ask the commissioners about supporting the Convention and Visitors Bureau travel brochure by buying an ad.
- Approve claims vouchers for the end of the month.

School budget woe discussed

"Suppose 98 kids come in?" he asked. "We will have more money in the budget, but will they still fit in the other two buildings?"

Campbell responded: "It's unrealistic to say we're going to gain that much."

Central principal Sharon Gregory said talk of closing the school has lowered teacher morale.

"We've lived under the cloud that Central would close since September," she said. "The cloud was so thick it was sometimes hard to operate."

Raymer gave a presentation on increasing class size, saying there is not a lot of evidence to prove that smaller class sizes are better. He handed out summaries of articles supporting both sides and said he could print out full copies of any articles members wanted to read.

"Either way," he said, "people will say 'Why did you do it, or why not?'" Gregory said sometimes how much a student learns depends more on how well the teacher manages the class and other students' personalities than the class size. She noted that classes can become too small or too big.

Selby said he didn't think larger class sizes would affect students if there was no more than 20 students in each class.

Dick Liess, high school assistant principal, suggested the high school could save money by cutting the number of elective classes or reorganizing the class structure. The board briefly discussed offering students who don't plan to attend college a program that wouldn't require as many credits to

North Dakota changes policy on biotech wheat

BISMARCK, N.D. (AP) — The North Dakota Farm Bureau has changed its policy on biotech wheat, favoring a "cautious approach" to commercialization rather than a moratorium.

Delegates to the farm group's recent annual meeting voted 56-49 to make the change, said spokesman Brian Kramer.

State Farm Bureau President Eric Aasmundstad said Monday that the change of the year-old policy "brings us more in line with the core philosophy of our organization."

"We're very supportive of free enterprise. Let the market dictate what is going to happen," Aasmundstad said.

Many farmers and officials worry that biotech wheat could harm producers because some U.S. export customers have said they do not want it.

State lawmakers in 2001 rejected a two-year ban on genetically engineered wheat seed and instead called for a study of the issues surrounding biotechnology.

The Legislature next year will consider a bill that sets up a state board to monitor the development of genetically engineered wheat. The 12-member board would be made up largely of farmers, grain industry officials and state officials.

The North Dakota Farmers Union still supports a state-imposed moratorium on biotech wheat, said spokesman Bob Kjelland. That group's annual convention is slated for mid-December.

"It will be a topic of discussion among members," Kjelland said.

One company that sells biotech seed, Monsanto Co. of St. Louis, has been developing a genetically engineered variety of hard red spring wheat resistant to its Roundup weed killer.
